## Divine Mercy Sunday

This is the Sunday when I most like to recall the mercies of God throughout this past year. Let me invite you into a similar meditation.

Remembering back, what victories did you have in holding your temper, in holding your tongue, in holding back a savvy “shade” on someone? That’s mercy.

Blessed are those who have not had unkind words spoken to them; more blessed indeed are those who have not spoken unkind words themselves.

What physical challenges have you overcome this year? Did you fall prey to the horrible flu, or the bad colds of this season, or even pneumonia? How blessed are you who were sick and are now well. Even more blessed are those who stayed with you, cared for you, nursed and doctored you back to health. They have shown mercy, and mercy will be shown to them.

How about your prayer life? Did you experience the comfort and companionship of the Holy Spirit as you navigated the depths of Christ’s life in you? Maybe a faith community has welcomed and loved you. For that mercy, in the winter and spring of your days this year, be grateful. Even more blessed are those who have extended that friendship and grace.

I know a little bit about mercy, because I am the endless recipient of it. On this Divine Mercy Sunday, I offer this suggestion. Find the image of Divine Mercy. Stand in front of it. Imagine the healing rays coming from the heart of Jesus pouring straight into whatever part of your body or soul is hurting. Let those rays in. The mercy of the Risen One longs to pour into you.

Jesus, we trust in you.

¿Y qué tal tu vida de oración? ¿Experimentaste el consuelo y la compañía del Espíritu Santo al adentrarte en la profundidad de la vida de Cristo en ti? Tal vez fuiste acogido y bienvenido por una comunidad de fe. Por esa misericordia, en el invierno y la primavera de tus días en este año, siéntete agradecido. Aún más bienaventurados son aquellos que te ofrecieron esa amistad y gracia.

Yo conozco un tanto acerca de la misericordia, porque soy receptora infinita de ella. En este Domingo de la Divina Misericordia, te ofrezco esta sugerencia. **Questions of the week~**

First Reading

In Acts, Luke records many of the "signs and wonders" performed by the Apostles in Jerusalem in the aftermath of Jesus' resurrection. Where do you see miraculous events occurring today in your faith community?

Second Reading

Today, we hear of one of the early visions of the resurrected Jesus that John received while exiled on the island of Patmos. What do you see as the main message Jesus was communicating to John in this initial vision?

Gospel Reading

The "doubting Thomas" resurrection narrative is one of the best-known Gospel stories surrounding Jesus' resurrection appearances. What role does doubt play in your spiritual journey?

**GOSPEL MEDITATION -**

He has you in mind. Do we think about that much? The God of the universe has us in mind, individually as persons and together as one human family. We hear this truth in today's Gospel story of Thomas. His doubt is likely familiar to us by now. "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nailmarks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe."

Jesus is God. He could have risen any way he wanted. He could have risen perfectly healed, as a further sign of his power over death and suffering. But when Thomas encounters him, we see what Jesus chose. "Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe." In resurrecting his body, Jesus already has Thomas in mind. Jesus retains his wounds for Thomas, for the disciples, and for all who would doubt the sacrificial power of love. This intentional love of Jesus is echoed by John and his disciples, who authored this Gospel. "Jesus did many other signs...these are written that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Christ...and that through this belief you may have life in his name."

From its earliest beginnings, the Church knew the power of sign and story. When they wrote the Gospels, they had us in mind. We are all Thomas from time to time. We need to see the mercy of God lived and real in our lives. This can happen throughout the circumstances of our daily comings and goings. It can also happen through meditating on the Scripture, through placing ourselves in the stories and listening to God's voice speaking. We don't get to see what the disciples got to see, but we know, through them, that God always has us in mind. As he reminds the disciples, "Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed."

Estas palabras tranquilizadoras disminuyeron la ansiedad de los discípulos y les dieron una maravillosa sensación de tranquilidad. Las palabras tienen el poder de hacer eso. Jesús toca a sus amigos con su aliento y respira su Espíritu sobre ellos. Este gesto íntimo de paz comienza a aliviar la incertidumbre y el temor que, sin duda, consumieron sus pensamientos y corazones. Las palabras y los gestos son tan importantes para hacer la obra de Dios. Incluso el más simple de los saludos y acciones puede conmover profundamente a las personas y dirigir las a Dios. En este domingo de la Divina Misericordia, se nos recuerda que el amor compasivo y misericordioso de Dios nos llega a través de Cristo resucitado. Con nuestras palabras y acciones, podemos mostrar ese perdón y amor misericordioso a los demás.
