## Third Sunday of Easter

Even though it's nowhere in scripture, tradition says that Peter, when an old man, was dragged away and crucified. Because he did not feel worthy to receive the same death as his Lord, Peter asked to be crucified upside down. Scripture never tells us where or when this took place, but the author of John's gospel certainly knows about it, because he says that Jesus's words to Peter---*the day will come when you will be led where you do not want to go--- signified by what kind of death Peter would glorify God.*

Peter was probably martyred by Emperor Nero in Rome in the mid-60s, AD. The origin of the tradition of him being crucified upside down is unknown. But his death HAS glorified God, hasn't it, all these centuries? Hasn't the image of Peter begging to endure a more humiliating death than even Jesus endured been a source of inspiration and strength to you from the day you first heard it?

We don't have to dance around the facts of the resurrection. The eyewitnesses to the empty tomb, and to the Risen One, didn't say things like, "Well, he's risen in our hearts," or "We feel his Spirit and are strengthened." That would never be enough to ask your executioners to nail you to a cross upside down.

Peter and all the martyred ones went to their deaths utterly positive that the grave that held Jesus was empty, and that Christ would raise them up with him. The witness---that's another word for "martyr"---of those first believers rings out throughout the ages: He is Risen, and our lives and deaths are meant to give glory to that Name.

## Tercer Domingo de Pascua

Aunque no aparece en ningún lugar de las escrituras, la tradición dice que Pedro, cuando era anciano, fue arrastrado por la fuerza y crucificado. Como no se sentía digno de recibir la misma muerte que su Señor, Pedro pidió que lo crucificaran boca abajo. Las escrituras nunca nos dicen dónde o cuándo sucedió esto, pero con certeza el autor del evangelio de Juan estaba muy bien enterado de todo, ya que nos dice que las palabras de Jesús a Pedro—*llegará el día cuando te llevarán a donde no quieras ir—apuntaban al tipo de muerte con el cual Pedro glorificaría a Dios.*

Posiblemente Pedro fue martirizado por el Emperador Nero en Roma a mediados de los años sesentas después de Cristo. Se desconoce el origen de la tradición por la cual fue crucificado boca abajo. Pero su muerte HA glorificado a Dios por todos estos siglos. ¿No ha sido para ti desde el primer día que supiste una fuente de inspiración y fuerza la imagen de Pedro soportando una muerte aún más humillante que la de Jesús?

No tenemos que atar cabos con los hechos de la resurrección. Los testigos presenciales de la tumba vacía, y del Resucitado, no dijeron tales cosas como, "Bueno, él ha resucitado en nuestros corazones," o "Sentimos su Espíritu y nos sentimos fortalecidos." Eso jamás sería suficiente para pedirle a tus ejecutores que te crucifiquen boca abajo.

Pedro y todos los mártires fueron a sus muertes totalmente convencidos de que la tumba donde Jesús estuvo estaba vacía, y que Cristo los resucitaría a ellos junto a él. El testimonio—esa es otra palabra para "mártires"—de aquellos primeros creyentes resuena por todas las épocas: Él ha Resucitado, y nuestras vidas y nuestras muertes deben dar gloria a ese Nombre.

**Questions of the week~**

First Reading

In the immediate weeks and months following Jesus' resurrection, the Apostles performed many miracles, but they also suffered for their faith and for preaching about Jesus. Why do you think non-believers even today are threatened by Jesus' resurrection from the dead?

Second Reading

What does John's vision reveal to us about the unseen order?

Gospel Reading

Three times the resurrected Lord asks Peter, "Do you love me?" And three times Jesus tells Peter to "feed/tend my sheep/lambs." Jesus then foreshadowed Peter's martyrdom. What do you make of this exchange between Jesus and Peter?

**GOSPEL MEDITATION -**

"Simon Peter said to them, 'I am going fishing.'" Peter is a favorite apostle for many people. I wonder if it is because of his flawed, relatable humanity. Today's Gospel takes place after Jesus appears to the disciples and breathes the Holy Spirit upon them. And yet, Peter finds himself returning to his old way of life, to comfortable habits he formed long before following Jesus. Is something still lingering in him? Is something still lingering in us? Lent is over, and we should be rejoicing! But do you feel like you're still holding onto something? Or perhaps you had an excellent Lent. You encountered Jesus in a new way and grew in faith. But as the weeks since Easter have slipped by, some of your newfound devotion has begun to waver. The closeness you felt in your Lenten commitments has given way to humdrum status quo or turn-of-the-season busyness.

"Simon, son of John, do you love me?" Peter has endured so much in his walk of discipleship! But something is still weighing on him. In today's Gospel, Jesus confirms Peter's devotion three times, a redemption of his earlier threefold denial. The call of the Lord must come again, as if heard anew for the first time. So often, this is the pattern of the Christian life. We discover God and experience a new desire for our faith, but in time, our enthusiasm begins to wane. Perhaps something happens that startles us, or we startle ourselves by a poor decision. Then we discover God anew! Our joy returns...for a while. Even the Apostles were no strangers to the cyclical nature of spiritual growth. Our disappointments or frustrations should not be cause for giving up. Like Peter, we too can recommit and start anew. This Sunday and every day of our lives, Jesus is waiting to say again, "Follow me."
