FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Jesus invited his disciples to be Real Salt, and Real Light, and by accounts, we have of the earliest Christians, they really were. The second-century theologian Tertullian imagined the pagans observing the behavior of the Christians and saying, “See how they love one another!”

Our parish is hosting an eye-opening class on Racial Equity. I realize, to my shock, that the places where I thought I was bringing salt---like taking a Spanish class in order to know a tiny bit about the parishioners in my heavily Hispanic parish years ago---were the same places I was rubbing salt in old wounds---like nominating myself to proclaim the Spanish-language reading, poorly, instead of yielding it to the actual Spanish speakers in the parish. Shivers.

I learned in class about an African-American employer who asked a young, white male applying for a job if he noticed her color. He gave the same answer I imagine myself giving, “Not at all. I don’t see color.” The interviewer helped him understand that it’s okay, it’s honest, really, to say something like, “Of course I see your color. If I didn’t I wouldn’t see you.”

Why was he afraid to give that answer? Perhaps he was wrestling with an unconscious assumption that seeing color means seeing someone who is “less than,” and he doesn’t see her that way. And that goes in both directions. When people of all ethnic backgrounds insist they don’t “see color,” might they also be really saying, “I don’t see you with the damaged worldview that I might have unconsciously received from the culture”?

Real salt. Real light. Jesus challenges us to bring Real Peace by sweeping out the dusty corners of our own hearts.

Have you ever noticed yourself making assumptions about people who look different from you?

Nuestra parroquia está ofreciendo una clase para abrirnos los ojos acerca de la Igualdad Racial. Me di cuenta, para mi gran sorpresa, de que los sitios a los cuales llevaba mi sal—como por ejemplo: hace unos años tomé una clase de español para poder saber un poquito ms acerca de los miembros de la parroquia hispanos—esos sitios eran los mismos en los cuales ponía sal a las viejas heridas—como nominarme yo misma a leer las lecturas con mi español roto, en lugar de ceder esa tarea a las personas que realmente son hispano-hablantes en la parroquia. Me estremezco de pensarlo.

En la clase nos contaron de una empleadora afroamericana que le preguntó a un joven blanco a quien estaba entrevistando para un empleo que si había visto su color de piel. Él contestó como me imagino yo hubiese contestado, “Para nada. No me fijo en el color.” La mujer que lo entrevistaba le explicó que está bien, es realmente honesto, decir algo como, “Por supuesto que vi el color de tu piel. Si no lo viera, no te viera a ti.”

¿Por que tenía miedo de contestar esa pregunta? Tal vez porque luchaba contra una suposición inconsciente de que fijarte en el color de la piel de alguien significa verlos como “menos,” y él no la veía así. Y eso aplica en ambas direcciones. Cuando la gente de todos los orígenes étnicos insiste en que no “ven color,” ¿No estarán realmente diciendo, “no te veo con esa forma distorsionada de ver la vida que pude haber recibido inconscientemente de la cultura”?

Sal verdadera. Luz Verdadera. Jesús nos reta a crear Paz Verdadera al barrer todos los polvorrientos rincones de nuestros propios corazones.

¿Alguna vez te has sorprendido a ti mismo haciendo suposiciones acerca de la gente de aspecto diferente al tuyo?

GOSPEL

What does it mean to be salt and light? If we listen carefully to Jesus' words, we gain some direction. To be salt means to bring taste, zest, and joy to life. We are asked to liven things up a bit by allowing the joy of our faith to spill over into the lives of others. Only a sincere and deep relationship with God can freshen up humanity and set it on proper course. To be light means that our faith must translate into action so that we can be Christ for others and extend the same arm of mercy and compassion that Christ did. Our acts of piety, then, cannot be directed solely at ourselves. Prayer is never about self-benefit but must always be directed toward union with God, deepening our relationships with one another and learning how to be effective stewards of the beautiful universe God has entrusted to our care. The Master gives us wise direction in terms of how we can best become the salt and light he desires. Listen carefully to the Beatitudes. Think about the oppression and alienation that exists in our world, the violence and prejudice, the anger and the hatred, the fear and the shame. All of these things require action. The poor need food, housing, and clothes. Hatred must be replaced by love. Retaliation and violence by forgiveness. Our thoughts and speech can become more like Christ. We can change and continue to change. Blessed John Henry Cardinal Newman said, "To live is to change and to be perfect is to have changed often." But it doesn't end with just offering the bandages needed to heal wounds. It must go deeper. We must ask ourselves what has happened that we have found ourselves in this place with these wounds and divisions. What are their causes? Together we must address these systemic problems, politically and spiritually, and face the truth. Only then will we truly be salt and light. But then again, we may not like what the light shows us.

LIVE THE LITURGY

Before the arrival of GPS and other technological advances, folks relied on a compass to assist them with directions. If set and used properly, people who would otherwise be lost could find their way. What properly sets our God compass? We know that we require God in order to find our way through life, but we need to be in proper relationship with God before this can effectively happen. God certainly does not need to be placated, but some things open Him up to us more than others. Isaiah gives us a clue today. Share your bread with the hungry ... clothe the naked ... remove oppression, false accusation, and malicious speech ... satisfy the afflicted. When we do this, we will not only be on proper course and in right relationship with God, but will be the salt and light Jesus asks us to be.

Questions of the Week

First Reading

The prophet Isaiah spoke of God's desire for us to take care of each other, especially the most vulnerable — the hungry, homeless, and afflicted. How often do you take care of others in need?

Second Reading

Early in his first letter to the Christians in Corinth, Paul speaks of the tension between human wisdom and the power of God. Why do you think Paul saw a trap in relying on human wisdom?

Gospel Reading

In his Sermon on the Mount, Jesus teaches the disciples that in doing "good deeds" they will be seen as "salt of the earth" and "light of the world" and thereby "glorify your heavenly Father." How do you think this glorifies God?

MEDITACIÓN DEL EVANGÉLIO

Ni siquiera nos podemos imaginar el mundo sin sal y sin luz; ambos son importantes para la vida humana. La sal da sabor a la comida y la luz incrementa la visibilidad. Por esta razón, nuestro compromiso al discipulado cristiano por medio del bautismo debe de dar sabor y luz al estilo de Cristo. El discipulado siempre debe de llevar al discernimiento del cómo se relaciona la persona con Dios y con los demás. En las lecturas, especialmente el Evangelio, Jesús dice claramente que si la sal pierde su sabor no sirve para nada. Advierte claramente a sus discípulos con la siguiente catequesis: "Ustedes son la sal de la tierra. Si la sal se vuelve insípida, ¿cómo se le devolverá el sabor? Ya no sirve para nada y se tira a la calle para que la pise la gente." (Mateo 5:13). Enseguida, también dice: "Ustedes son la luz del mundo." (Mateo 13:14). ¡Vaya compromiso el que se tiene al ser discípulo de Jesús!

Ahora, la pregunta es: ¿Qué clase de sabor doy? Soy persona amargada, egoísta que donde me presento cambia el ambiente y la conversación por la negatividad que perciben los demás en mí o por el contrario, soy sal y luz en la familia, trabajo y comunidad. No se debe de olvidar que Cristo es la sal y la luz para todos. "Parece poca cosa" pero el Señor 'con pocas cosas nuestras hace milagros, hace maravillas' por lo tanto, es necesario tener esta actitud de 'humildad' que consiste en buscar solamente ser sal y luz." (Papa Francisco). Pero, ojo, no se puede ser sal y luz sin relación personal con Cristo que es sal y luz en mí.
