Dear Community Members,

Surrexit Dominus vere. Alleluia! The Lord is risen indeed. Alleluia! I wish all of you a Blessed and Joyous Easter. Today, Christ shows us the result of the “felix culpa,” the “happy fault” mentioned in the Easter Vigil’s Exultet. The “happy fault” is the sin of the first Adam, expiated by the New Adam. The Exultet proclaims: “O happy fault, that merited to have such and so great a Redeemer.”

“You see, had our first parents not fallen by sin, they would have remained in a state of supernatural grace. Eventually they would have been taken into heaven, and would have shared in the vision of God. For unfallen persons, that would be the deepest possible union between God and human beings.

“Now again, why does the Church lead us to rejoice in the Fall of the human race? The reason is that through the redemption of Jesus Christ we have been restored to the supernatural state in a way far surpassing in glory what we could have known had there been no Fall.”

The above two paragraphs are not mine. They are the words of Rev. Raymond O. Ryland, from an article he wrote for The Coming Home Network International, April 3, 2012. Father Ryland (RIP) is the grandfather of our own Christopher Ryland. Father Ryland was one of the first Episcopalian priests to be granted the dispensation to continue his sacred priesthood as a convert to Roman Catholicism.

Holy Week was certainly a “tour de force,” wasn’t it? None of it would have been possible were it not for the devoted efforts of so many, and I thank them all: The Handmaids of the Lord, Mr. Robert Clayton and our Choir and Schola, Mr. Tom Pyron and our top-flight altar servers, Mr. Michael Nauman and our Ushers and Security Men, those who assisted with the decoration of the church.
