Dear Community Members,

Well, your Chaplain's up this week for the bulletin letter. I'll also be writing to you next week before I leave for vacation. Thereafter, Father Orłowski will once again take over the bulletin letter until I return.

As I mentioned Sunday, I never ask anyone, i.e., a volunteer, assistant or subordinate, to do anything I won't do myself. I believe that, to do otherwise, is shirking responsibility or, perhaps, even a kind of exploitation of people. I would never ask anyone of you here to do anything I wouldn't do myself, that is, provided I have the ability, resources, knowledge and experience.

When I was in seminary, I was head sacristan. When it came time to divvy out jobs, I took the job that I knew was the most boring, time-consuming and the most distasteful. It wasn't the dirtiest job, but the dirty jobs got done very quickly and never showed their ugly heads more than once a week. The job I assigned myself was the laundering and care of linens: altar linens, i.e., altar cloths as well as Mass linens; and albs. It was a job that took hours, both on our primary work-day which was Saturday and several evenings during the week. Then it started all over again.

So, I decided to preach at both Masses for quite a few Sundays, so I could go off on my vacation with a clear conscience, i.e., not burdening Father Orłowski unduly and also not shirking my own responsibilities. So, after this Sunday, he'll be celebrating all Masses and preaching them as well. Well, sure, this is what I used to do all the time – and what he did too when he acted as my substitute. But still, I always try to do everything I can not to take advantage of people. That said, it's still a fact that people have responsibilities and these responsibilities shouldn't be ignored. As I said from the pulpit last Sunday, there are various things to be done here in our community. Somebody's got to do these things and of course, somebody will, but it's anybody's guess as to whether somebody's going to step up when needed, or will nobody bother. If that happens, I'm sure everybody will be unhappy about that.

Well, to switch gears and round this letter up, I'll be leaving Saturday, 15 August and will return 1 September. I'll be in my great little vacation house on Anna Maria Island. I've been checking the weather and, without exception, the temperature there is consistently at least 10° cooler than it is here. Florida in the summer? What? You bet, my children and my friends.
