Public Sunday Vespers: In preparation for praying Vespers (the Church's evening prayer) publicly at our parish, Fr. McCambridge wishes to have a sufficient number of books. The plan is for Vespers at 2:00 pm on Sundays. Those interested, please add your name to the list in the vestibule, and the number of family members who will use books.

Building News: Inspection by several roofers reveals the need to replace our roof; bids have been sought. The roof will be replaced before the repair of eaves and soffits. Before either of these, several large trees will be removed from behind the church, which currently drop large amounts of debris on the roof, and which pose a threat, in case they should fall. Discussion has begun with the architect and an excavator for installing underground drains for groundwater and for roof runoff.

Display of Sacred Relics: A Vatican collection of more than 150 relics, some as old as 2,000 years, will be displayed in Arkansas this month. They will include relics of St. Maria Goretti, St. Therese of Lisieux, St. Francis of Assisi, St. Anthony of Padua, St. Thomas Aquinas and St. Faustina Kowalska. There will be present a portion of Our Lady's veil, as well as one of the largest remaining pieces of the True Cross in the world. The faithful will be able to examine and venerate each relic. In the Church's history, many miracles and healings have been worked in the presence of relics, and many have been healed through this ministry. All are encouraged to bring articles of devotion (such as rosaries, holy cards, etc.) and pictures of sick loved ones, to be touched to the reliquaries as a means of intercession.
