First Communion, 2019: First Holy Communions will be made Sunday, April 28, 2019, at the 10:45 mass. Candidates are to be seven years old by that time, not yet having made First Communion. Parents of eligible children should please notify Fr. McCambridge as soon as possible. Fr. Braun will begin First Communion catechism on Sunday, January 27, between the Masses, at 9:15, with classes each Sunday through April 7.

Display of Sacred Relics: A Vatican collection of more than 150 relics, some as old as 2,000 years, will be displayed in Arkansas this month. They will include relics of St. Maria Goretti, St. Therese of Lisieux, St. Francis of Assisi, St. Anthony of Padua, St. Thomas Aquinas and St. Faustina Kowalska. There will also be present a portion of Our Lady's veil, as well as one of the largest remaining pieces of the True Cross in the world. The faithful will be able to examine and venerate each relic. In the Church's history, many miracles and healings have been worked in the presence of relics, and many have been healed through this ministry. Please do not miss this opportunity. You are encouraged to bring your articles of devotion (such as rosaries, holy cards, etc.) and pictures of ill friends/family members, which you will be able to touch to the reliquaries as a means of intercession.
