Suspension of Public Masses Extended: This past Wednesday, His Excellency, Bishop Taylor, announced his extension of the suspension of public masses until May 18, as well as his dispensation of the faithful from the obligation of assisting at Holy Mass.

Rogation Day: This Saturday, April 25, is what is known as a “Rogation Day.” The Rogation Days are “Days of prayer, and formerly also of fasting, instituted by the Church to appease God’s anger at man’s transgressions, to ask protection in calamities, and to obtain a good and bountiful harvest,” according to the old *Catholic Encyclopedia*. A Rogation procession will be made by Father and the seminarians before the mass this Saturday.
