Flannery O'Connor, an American Catholic novelist, kept a prayer journal, a simple marble composition notebook, while she was in college in lowa in 1947. In one of her entries she wrote, "What I am asking for is really very



ridiculous. Oh, Lord, I am saying, at present I am a cheese, make me a mystic, immediately."

I can't be certain what she meant. I try to imagine how I used to think and pray when I was college-aged. I suspect, though, that she was praying that her life could begin to flow. Cheese is something that used to be liquid, runny, and splash-able - but somewhere along the way it coagulates or curdles. It doesn't flow anymore.

We're well into August now. Our young people are heading off to college. It will be a time for them when life really starts flowing in a new direction. Our prayer for them is that they too would pray and become mystics - to see how God is helping their lives to become a gushing-forth in grace.

We pray for ourselves too. Throughout this season of restriction and shutdown, maybe we're feeling like our spirits have become coagulated like cheese. Let's see if we can discern how God is trying to get some mystical juices flowing for us - into a new season and new beginning.


Assumption of Mary Holy Day Mass
