### Reflecting on our relationship with Christ

In Sunday's gospel Jesus asks two questions to his disciples: "Who do people say that the Son of Man is?" and "Who do you say that I am?" Peter's quick reply to the latter was, "You are the Christ." Did he know what he was saying? Now, 2000 years later, I ponder that second question.

A recent retreat I attended was based on this Scripture passage and provided me with a new perspective. We spent our time for meditation and prayer focusing on reverse questioning. Who am I? How do I see myself? How does Jesus see me? How do I want Jesus to see me?

Reflecting on my relationship with Jesus offered new insights and a desire to follow him more closely. I often take for granted that he is a constant in my life – always present to me, whether or not I acknowledge him. Sunday's psalm proclaims, "I will give thanks to you, O Lord, with all my heart....Your kindness, O Lord, endures forever." How blessed are we! Barbara K. D'Artois
