FROM FR. JOE.....

There's lots and lots to share with you this week as the foundation date of St. André's Parish is just around the corner...

40 Hours

Most importantly, please take note of the insert in this Sunday's bulletin concerning all the celebrations scheduled around July 1st. Our 40 Hours Devotions in April 2013 were such a great success, and there's been so much interest in having them again, that they seemed the most logical way to mark the birth of a new parish here in Malone. (Br. André had a great devotion to the Most Blessed Sacrament, even having a window cut in the wall of his quarters at the original Oratory in Montréal so that he'd be able to see the tabernacle and adore the Lord from his room.) Make plans now to take part in as much as you are able in a couple of weeks.

Offering Envelops

Becoming a single parish means uniting our finances, and that includes our weekly offering envelopes. A single, St. André's envelope will replace the four colors we now use to distinguish contribution made to the separate parishes. It had been my goal to have the new envelopes in place for the beginning of July, but the company which prints and mails out our envelopes was not able to meet that deadline. Your July/August packets should begin arriving soon, and will still contain the "old" envelopes, but they'll all be going together into the "new" account. As of July 1st, checks should be made out to St. André's Parish, and not to Malone Catholic Parishes or the individual churches. We've been promised that the new envelopes will be in place for the next mailing.

Mass Intentions/Mass Schedule

It's been customary that we begin taking Mass intentions for the following calendar year on July 1st, and it's a date many parishioners await anxiously. After consulting with the Pastoral Council, I've decided we will be postponing that "opening" date for 2015 intentions until mid-August. This is for two reasons. (1) July 1st is already going to be busy enough this year! (2) As I mentioned in my homilies on May 10/11 and 17/18, I believe the time has come for us to reconsider our Sunday Mass schedule, and the information gathered at our listening sessions indicates that many of you feel the same. It would not make much sense for us to start scheduling intentions which would soon enough have to be rescheduled. The Pastoral Council and I will be looking for your input about this in the next few weeks.

Parish Trustees

The formation of a new parish involves appointing new trustees. NYS law requires that each parish corporation have two lay trustees who, together with the Bishop, the Vicar General of the Diocese, and the Pastor, form the corporate board which represents the interests of the parish in all legal affairs. Currently, we have a total of eight trustees--two from each individual parish. Beginning July 1st, the trustees appointed for St. André's will be Jim Coughlin and Pam Leduc. They've already gotten their feet wet attending a couple of Pastoral Council meetings, and will soon be meeting with me to review the 2014-2015 budget for the new parish. SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Parents who wish to have a child baptized should contact Sister Barbara to make arrangements for the date and for a program of preparation. Parents are highly encouraged to make arrangements at least three months before the child is born, as the Catholic Church encourages Baptism for infants as soon as possible after birth. Adults and older children (seven years or older) interested in Baptism or entering into full communion with the Catholic Church should inquire about the program of preparation (R.C.I.A.: the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults).

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

A Catholic wishing to be married in one of our churches should contact one of the priests at least six months prior to the desired date in order to begin making arrangements. A program of preparation is required. The parish should be contacted before any other plans are made—for example, the wedding reception.

SACRAMENT OF THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK

For those preparing for surgery, nursing home residents, or the homebound, contact one of the parish priests to make arrangements to be anointed. For those in the hospital (especially in the event of an emergency), ask the hospital staff to contact the priest on call.
