St. André Bessette (1845-1937) spent much of his life serving as the door-keeper of his religious community; like him, we strive to open doors for our neighbors to experience the loving mercy of God. We've all been moved to hear of the suffering of our neighbors to the south in the wake of **Hurricanes Florence and Michael**... and the season isn't over yet. The U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops and Catholic Charities USA have set up an *Emergency Collection for 2018 Disasters*, to offer relief for the humanitarian, long-term recovery, and Church needs which will arise. St. André's Parish is sending \$3,000.00 from our charitable funds (raised by the hard work of our volunteers at the St. Vincent's Thrift Store); anyone wishing to add to this amount should get their contribution to the parish office before the end of October and mark it "2018 Disasters."

It's that time of year again: **It's time for the Nazarite Challenge!**

It's time for Catholic men to let their God-given masculine glory sprout right out of their chins! In 2016 and 2017, Fr. Scott and I invited the men of St. André's to join us in bearded bliss as part of a Catholic take on "No-Shave November."

And both years we were pleasantly surprised to see just how many out in the pews took us up on it. In the Bible, Nazarites—such as Sampson and John the Baptist—were men consecrated to God by several vows, including to not shave or cut their hair... which is why you find Sampson uttering what could easily be the motto of every hairy-faced man in salvation history: "If I am shaven, then my strength will leave me, and I shall become weak, and be like any other man" (Judges 16:17). Stitt to grow a beard last November...and that he'd choose to grow it again a few months ago—this time for keeps!) Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ:

The weekend of October 20-21 our diocesan family joins Catholics across the globe in celebrating World Mission Sunday. We join our sisters and brothers around the world who will gather at the Lord's Table to celebrate our common vocation as missionaries.

In his message for this year's celebration, Pope Francis tells us that "life is a mission" and he reminds us that "each one of us is called to reflect on this fact: I am a mission on this earth; that is the reason why I am here in this world." (*Evangeli Gaudium*, 273)

I invite all of us to see World Mission Sunday as a special moment to live out the mission we share as God's children, the mission to bring the Gospel to the whole world. SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Parents who wish to have a child baptized should contact Rev. Joseph Giroux to make arrangements for the date and for a program of preparation. Parents are highly encouraged to make arrangements at least three months before the child is born, as the Catholic Church encourages Baptism for infants as soon as possible after birth. Adults and older children (seven years or older) interested in Baptism or entering into full communion with the Catholic Church should inquire about the program of preparation (R.C.I.A.: the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults).

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

A Catholic wishing to be married in one of our churches should contact one of the priests at least six months prior to the desired date in order to begin making arrangements. A program of preparation is required. The parish should be contacted before any other plans are made—for example, the wedding reception.

SACRAMENT OF THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK

For those preparing for surgery, nursing home residents, or the homebound, contact one of the parish priests to make arrangements to be anointed. For those in the hospital (especially in the event of an emergency), ask the hospital staff to contact the priest on call.
