Why do Catholics teach Christ rose on the third day? Given a Friday crucifixion and Sunday's resurrection, I barely count two days.

There are a couple of issues to consider here. To begin with, Jesus' resurrection from the dead was an event that happened both in and out of time. Theologians say it was a transcendental event with historical consequences. Because Jesus' resurrection is not like anything we have ever seen before and bears little or no resemblance to any other historical event, our concepts of time falter when trying to express exactly what happened.

that Jesus spent in the tomb is much less important than what he did there. What really matters is that he conquered death, vacated the tomb, and entered into his risen and glorified

Jesus' day were not as precise in their measurement of time as we are today. We tend to measure time in terms of hours, minutes, and seconds. They thought in terms of sunrises and sunsets. When seen in this light, the typical explanation given to the three-day time frame of Jesus' death and resurrection is that it took place in the course of three separate days: Good Friday (when Jesus was condemned to death and crucified), Holy Saturday (when Jesus lay in the tomb), and Easter (Sunday, when Jesus rose from

LITURGY OF THE WORD FOR

CHILDREN...Allows children the opportunity to hear the readings of the Mass at their level. During the 8:30 and 10:30AM Masses, your children will be invited to come before the altar for the Children's Liturgy of the Word. After a short prayer, the Priest or Deacon will invite the children to go with one of our Children's



lectors into our gathering room while the rest of the parish community listens to the readings and the homily. They participate in age appropriate reflections on the week's readings and then discuss the readings in relation to their lives. The children then return to their families after the homily with a flyer related to that week's readings. They return during the Presentation of the Gifts in the main church, so that they can join their families for the Liturgy of the Eucharist. This program is meant for children aged 3 years and up. However, younger children are welcome to attend, when accompanied by a parent, so long as they can sit quietly and participate appropriately for 15 to 20 minutes. Children are invited to attend anytime they wish and there is no registration, fee or sign up for your children to enjoy this age appropriate teaching about Jesus.
