► On Thursday, September 14, we celebrate the Exultation of the Cross.

The symbol of the cross is an acceptance of the promise of life everlasting.

As members of the Catholic Church; we followers of Christ, are believers in His passion, death and resurrection as the basis of our faith, assurance life after this life.

We recognize not just the symbol of the cross, a 'tree of wood'; we acknowledge the Corpus, the Body of Christ on the Crucifix. If Christ had not suffered and died for our sake, there would have been no resurrection.

Our prayer included the words, "through His Cross and Resurrection, He has set us free, He is the Savior of the world".

Many times, we experience the cross as a simple object of jewelry, but to a Christian this symbol represents God the Son, representative of God the Father, who sent His own Son to the earth, that we may have eternal life. Jesus took on human flesh in order to conquer death.

The cross is the reminder that Jesus made restitution for the disobedience of our first parents. Adam and Eve succumbed to their temptation by the evil one, that first evil act, we call original sin. From that very incident in the Garden of Eden, human beings have suffered temptation by Satan.

When we have the courage to wear the crucifix on our person, or display in our homes, we stand for ultimate faith in God. One time I was confronted by someone who said to me, "you wear a cross on your collar, is that supposed to mean you are 'holier than thou'?"

My response was "that is not its purpose; I wear it to remind me daily that I am a sinner". It also reminds us that we will experience suffering in this world even in our innocence. But there can be true joy in suffering when we acknowledge the suffering of Jesus Christ and in our participation in that suffering ultimately results in heavenly, everlasting life in the presence of Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is a religious formation program that has its roots in Maria Montessori who believed that if you prepare the environment, children will learn. In 1954, Sofia Cavaletti used Maria's method to learning and developed materials

that would bring children ages 3-6 to God in a very special way. It is a program based in Scripture and the Mass, using hands-on materials to aid the children in learning more about God. The program is held in the Atrium on Thursdays from September to May from 1:00p to 2:30p. The Atrium is located in our Parish Center; we have a small altar, tabernacle, baptismal font, sample size vestments and other specially designed materials that are meant for hands-on experiences. The program is open to children ages 3 to 6 on a first-come, first served basis. Registration is for a year-long commitment and is limited to eight children. The fee for the year is \$25. FEAST FUN FACTS...When you hear the word "icon" do you think of a symbol on your computer screen that we click on to open up a program or file? What do you know about Religious Icons? The word "icon" means image and the story of icons in the Christian Church is a story of learning to gaze into the mystery of God. Our Catholic tradition has encouraged artists to use their gifts to praise God yet icons are not vehicles of an artist's personal expression. Rather, icons are unique forms of sacred art that conveys a symbolic presentation of the holy person that is depicted. When an iconographer creates an icon, it is called icon "writing" rather than "painting." Did you know that the specific icon of Our Lady in our Church is a version of the "Mother of God Umilyenie," a Russian word translating into English as mercy, compassion, tenderness or loving kindness? It was "written" by the hand of Marek Czarnecki in 1996. He did not set out to become an icon writer, the son of Polish immigrants and a graduate of New York's prestigious school of Visual Arts. He was working in Manhattan when his father had "volunteered" his son to write an icon of the patron of Poland – Our Lady of Czestochowa or the Black Madonna in the year 1991. He said, "I don't want this to sound presumptuous, but I think the Holy Spirit working through my pastor and father brought me to this work." Czarnecki ditched Manhattan and returned to Bristol, CT. Many consider Mark to be the premier iconographer in the U.S.
