



What is a Service Project?

Each service project should be an act of love done to help and assist our neighbors in their bodily or spiritual needs. We serve others because we first have been loved by God.

A project is something you commit yourself to for a significant amount of time in one day or for a continual period of time. Five to seven hours per project is encouraged.

First Year Service Requirement:

- One Service Project serving your family at home.
- One Service Project serving your Holy Spirit parish community.
- One Service Project serving the wider community.

After each project students must complete the *Service Project Form* and write a journal reflection about their experience using the *Service Reflection Form*.

Updated Covid Project Suggestions:

Family: Going beyond your normal at home:

- Volunteer to make and clean up dinner
- Mow the lawn and shovel the snow for your grandparents
- Babysit weekly for your siblings
- Tutor a younger sibling in a particular subject
- Empty the dishwasher every day for a month (These can be common household chores, but it should be something your parents have not already asked you to do.)
