

When we fail, we must get up and start again. Compromising with anything less than Jesus simply means following the world and its values and not following our Lord.





# Finance Committee Meeting January 26, 2017

Members Present: Father Jacek, Theodore Sherrill, Maureen Dillon, John Kurilla, John O'Malia, Bob Burns, Michael Flynn, Rosemary Coates, and Debbie Madrack. Also present was Debbie Goodman.

The meeting opened with a prayer.

John Sipper, Pastoral Council, addressed the committee looking for anyone interested in joining the Pastoral Council. Anyone interested should contact him or Father Jacek.

#### **Old Business**

- 1. The men's restroom refurbishing has been completed.
- 2. The Holy Child kitchen cleaning has begun and will be completed by the next fund raiser.
- 3. The two lower church door thresholds have been repaired. The door to the ramp is not completed. It was also suggested the back side door threshold to the church [rectory side] also be repaired.

#### **New Business**

- 1. Financial Statement for the second quarter was distributed and reviewed. It will be placed in this week's bulletin.
- 2. Christmas Collection for the past years was reviewed. The amount has declined for the last three years.
- 3. Ladies' restroom will also be refurbished with a changing table being installed.
- 4. Electric System in the rectory has had some problems. Sensor lights are working intermittently.
- 5. There have been problems with the church furnace turning on in very cold temperatures outside. It has been checked and should not happen again.
- 6. The church organ needs multiple repairs to return it to its former beautiful sound and preserved for the future. It has been estimated to be worth over half a million dollars. It was suggested a special collection be taken up after Easter.
- 7. Fund raisers for the year are:
  - a. Memorial Christmas Tree [a tree on the altar with ornaments purchased and names placed on the ornaments]
  - b. Snow Blower [limited number of tickets will be sold in October]
  - c. Bingo [May 21st]
  - d. Spaghetti or Roast Beef Dinner [September]
  - e. Lenten Fish Dinner [March 24th]
  - f. Nite at the Races [November 18th]
- 8. A Mardi Gras Party will be held on February 19<sup>th</sup> as a thank you from the Parish.

The next meeting date will be uesday, February 28<sup>th</sup> at 6 PM.

The meeting ended with a prayer.
