PARISH EVENTS

EASTER TRIDUUM AND EASTER SUNDAY

This year the Triduum will begin with the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, March 29th, 2018 @ 7PM.

After the <u>homily</u> of the Mass a ritual <u>washing of the feet</u> is done. We need a few more volunteers to sign up – the list is located on the table in the ramp area.

The Mass concludes with a procession of the Blessed Sacrament to the altar of repose.

Eucharistic adoration will follow until 10PM.

On Good Friday, March 30th, 2018 we will recall the <u>Passion</u> and <u>crucifixion</u> of Jesus @ 3PM.

During the Good Friday celebration a cross is ceremoniously unveiled.

In Roman Catholicism, the <u>clergy</u> traditionally begin the service <u>prostrate</u> in front of the altar.

Mass is not celebrated on Good Friday and the communion distributed at the Celebration of the Lord's Passion is consecrated on Holy Thursday.

Also in Roman Catholicism, images of saints are either kept or veiled until the Easter Vigil. Votive lights before these images are not lit.

Only one cross or crucifix per church is unveiled throughout the entire Good Friday service, for the purpose of veneration by the congregation. The faithful typically venerate the crucifix by kissing or touching the crucifix.

On Holy Saturday (3/31/18) we will have **blessing of "Easter Baskets"** at 11 AM and 1 PM in the church.

Easter Vigil on March 31, 2018

Held after nightfall on Holy Saturday @ 8PM in anticipation of the celebration of the resurrection of Jesus.

The ceremony of darkness and light is held in silence at the beginning of the Mass.

The Paschal candle, representing Jesus's resurrection as the "return of light onto the world," is lit.

The solemn procession to the altar with the Paschal candle is formed.

Once everyone has processed in, the Exsultet is intoned.

After the <u>Exsultet</u>, everyone is seated and listens to the 5-9 readings. These readings account salvation history, beginning with Creation.

People desiring full initiation in the Church who have completed their training are formally initiated as members of the faith in the Church through the Sacraments of <u>Initiation</u> (<u>Baptism</u>, <u>Confirmation</u> and the <u>Holy Eucharist</u>).

The annual Easter Vigil reception will be held on March 31st, after the 8:00 PM Mass at the Holy Child Faith Formation Center. If you would consider donating an item for the reception there is a donation item sign-up sheet located in the ramp area of the Church or you can call the parish office. With everyone's help and cooperation we will have a wonderful reception. Monetary donations can be placed in an envelope marked "Easter Vigil Reception" and placed in the weekend collection. Please drop off items for the reception before the Easter Vigil Mass (6:30 PM-7:45 PM) on March 31st. With everyone's help and cooperation we will have a wonderful reception. Thank you.

Easter Sunday on April 1, 2018 – The Mass of the Resurrection of the Lord

We will keep our regular Sunday schedule: 8:30 AM & 11:00 AM

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY – APRIL 8TH

At 2:00 PM we will keep Divine Mercy Hour by praying/singing The Divine Mercy Chaplet. It is done in combination with the exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and confessions. In the vision Jesus told St. Faustina, "My daughter, know that My Heart is mercy itself. From this sea of mercy, graces flow out upon the whole world. No soul that has approached Me has ever gone away unconsoled" (Diary 1777). The message of The divine Mercy is simple. It is that God loves us – all of us. And, he wants us to recognize that His mercy is greater than our sins, so that we will call upon Him with trust, receive His mercy, and let it flow through us to others.



Meeting began at 6:10 pm with opening prayer Previous meeting minutes were printed in 2/24/18 bulletin Ed W led Faith Sharing with a reflection on St. Anselm

Pastor report – preparing for Holy Week and Easter celebrations; looking at options for new truck

Committee Reports:

Community – Marsha reports that Easter Vigil reception donation sign-ups are going well; after a break due to unforeseen circumstances, the Welcoming Committee will once again contact new parishioners

Social Concerns – no report; there was a question about when the men from Mother Theresa's Haven will next be hosted

Word – new chair person needs to be selected at next meeting; no one currently in RCIA program; meeting of Faith Formation teachers was held

Worship – discussed Lenten and Easter preparation plans; a refresher course for altar servers is being planned
