#### **Parish Mission Statement**

We, All Saints Parish, are drawn together by the power of the Holy Spirit to be a living and convincing sign of God's unconditional love. We are gifted to build bonds among ourselves and others in order to live the Gospel in word, worship, community and service for the salvation of all and the building of God's kingdom.



In Luke's Gospel, the people are surprised but not immediately offended by Jesus' words in the synagogue. It is the words that follow his reading from the prophet Isaiah that seem to offend them. Jesus challenges and provokes the people of Nazareth by referring to examples in which Israel rejected the prophets. He also challenges them to respond to his message, the message of a prophet, in a way that is different from their ancestors. This call for a new response leads to his rejection. After Jesus' words of challenge, Luke reports that there was a movement to kill Jesus by throwing him over a cliff. This differs from the reports found in Mark and Matthew's Gospels, where Jesus is said to be unable to perform miracles in Nazareth because of the people's lack of faith. Luke says that Jesus walks away from the crowd that intended to kill him; it is not yet his time. The animosity of the people of Nazareth prefigures and prepares the reader of Luke's Gospel for the cross. Luke wants all to understand that it is through his death on the cross that Jesus offers God's salvation to all.

#### SMALL FAITH SHARING GROUPS



## All Saints Parish Finance Committee Meeting January 17, 2019

Members Present: Father Jacek, Theodore Sherrill, Maureen Dillon, Bob Burns, Rosemary Coates, Michael Flynn, John Kurilla, and Debbie Madrack. Also present was Debbie Goodman.

The meeting opened with a prayer.

#### **Old Business**

- 1. We are continuing to look for a replacement truck. We have received several leads so far.
- 2. The Shur Save Rewards Program has been registered and we are waiting for the approved email. There will then be additional information as how to sign up for participation using your number.
- 3. Plymouth Township Board of Supervisors has made an offer to purchase land at St. Mary's Cemetery. The Diocese must approve the sale and allocation of any funds realized prior to an agreement of sale being drawn up.

#### **New Business**

- 1. There have been 36 plots already sold in the new plots opened at St. Vincent's Cemetery.
- 2. Mrs. Goodman reported on the repairs needing attention or have been made:
  - The church bells have not been working correctly on the weekend. The unit is obsolete and has been turned off and used manually. Cost of a new control panel will be \$4,900.00 plus wiring. The daily bells are still fine.
  - There is a leak in the basement of the rectory beneath the kitchen. It is thought that a drain pipe from the roof inside the outer wall may be the problem. A company with a camera will search for the origin of the leak.
  - The Allen Organ in the church needs some servicing. It may be as simple as new batteries or more extensive servicing.
  - Some of the sidewalks need repairs. This cannot be done until the weather breaks. Until then bright paint will be sprayed near them for caution.
- 3. Mrs. Goodman distributed a sheet identifying all the 2018 Fundraisers and the profit realized.
- 4. There is a possible change of funeral director payment policy.
- 5. The 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter Financial Report was distributed and reviewed. It will be published in the bulletin.

The next meeting date will be Wednesday, April 10<sup>th</sup>, 2019, at 6 PM.

The meeting ended with a prayer.
