Mental fitness, AND we do all of the activities in a fun way while having adventures. Pack 106 has a strong emphasis on getting our youth outdoors through camping, hikes and community service. If you enjoy the outdoors and want your cub to learn more about nature, come join us at Pack 106.

To begin with, your cub is a member of Pack 106, which is in the Texas Skies District, belonging to the Sam Houston Area Council. The Pack is made up of dens, which is a group of boys or girls usually in the same grade. Each Den has a specific numeral attached to it, commonly referred to as the 'Den Number'. Collectively, we are Cub Scouts, and are members of the Boy Scouts of America who are also members of the World Scouting Movement.

All Packs have a Chartered Organization, which acts as a 'sponsor', and ours is St. Faustina in Fulshear, TX. Our pack is the primary pack for both Shafer and Randolph elementary schools, although we are open to any individuals that wish to join us.

The Den

Lots of Cub Scouting happens in the den. Please remember that your Cub Scout Den Leader is a volunteer putting forth his or her time and effort to help your cub 'do his or her best' to earn badges, participate in the fun, and gain all the positive values that the Cub Scout program offers. Den meetings usually occur twice a month. It will be up to your den leader's discretion on meeting times.

Remember the BSA stands for Boy Scouts of America, not Baby Sitters of America. Tiger parents are required to be with their Tiger at all meetings and activities. Older boys it is up to den leader for meeting, overnights require a guardian.

Please assist them in the following ways.

- Please have your cub to den meetings on time. Your den leaders have many activities planned and it is important to have the whole group together to begin the evening's fun and projects. Early is on time, on time is late, and late is unacceptable.
- Be an active parent. Everyone has special abilities and 'know how' that can be of great help in matters relating to Cub Scouts. Please make sure you have completed the Parent Talent Survey Sheet and return it to your leader. In addition to the boys learning new skills from you, I promise that you will have a good time helping them.
- Just Fix It! If you think your den leader is not doing something, jump in and help them. As a den leader I have forgotten to hand out badges. This is a great time to not just let me know as a leader I forgot, but to step in and do that role.

The dues help keep the pack running. These dues pay for the national dues, adult leader dues, pinewood derby car, badges, neckerchief, meeting space rentals, pack meeting material cost. Our treasurer will have a full breakdown of the cost per scout for those interested.

Uniform



Scouts in uniform are more conscious of their role in Cub Scouting, and feel a sense of pride and belonging when wearing one. A uniform provides a proper place for the display of badges earned and a way for him to 'show the world' that he has been rewarded for his achievements. In addition, Scouts in uniform create a strong, positive, visible image in the community that helps to strengthen the important ties between the public and the Scouting organization. Uniform should be worn to all pack meetings and flag ceremonies. I have my den wear their uniform, but I will leave that to the den leader to decide for their meeting.

Uniforms, patches, and accessories are available at the scout offices listed above, and they will be happy to assist you. Please note we will provide the 106. We have a special 106 patch that comes with your first year dues.

Class B

You will receive your class B at sign up. It is a part of your first year dues. This will be worn during day time activities and at the discretion of the den leader.

Events

We are an active pack and have a lot of events throughout the year for you and your cub to participate in. These events are family activities, we encourage you to bring the whole family but leave the pets at home! In order to have successful and safe events we do have rules and regulations that must be followed. These are in place to ensure if there is an incident the BSA will cover the incident with their insurance.

Some of the rules may seem extreme and you may not follow on your own time. We do ask though while on a Cub Scout campout we follow these rules.

Basic Rules

- All participants **MUST** have a medical form. This includes siblings, mom, dad, ect... There will be forms available on sign up night.

- All cubs must have a guardian on a campout.
- No pets.
- No RV.
- Fire Safety
 - Cubs will not be permitted to add sticks to a fire unless asked to by leadership.
 - Cubs will not be permitted to remove sticks from the fire.
 - Cubs will not run around the fire area.
- No riding in the back of trucks.



- As outlined in the Scouter Code of Conduct, Scouting activities are not a place to possess, distribute, transport, consume, or use any of the following items prohibited by law or in violation of any Scouting rules, regulations, and policies: alcoholic beverages or controlled substances, including marijuana.
- In addition, the Code of Conduct specifies that if you are taking prescription medications with the potential of impairing any functioning or judgment, you will not engage in activities that would put Scouts at risk, including driving or operating equipment.
- No firearms or ammunition
- No drones or unmanned aerial vehicles allowed at outdoor events unless use and flight plan is approved by the Pack Committee
