



FROM THE PASTOR.....

Here is an update as to where we stand with the building fund and our building projects. First of all, thanks to you all for your generosity over the recent months when it comes to our parish. Through direct donations and the several other means of raising money for the building fund, we were able to reach an amount of little more than \$110,000. The main focus for the building fund is the renovation of the main kitchen and the main bathrooms. But as was mentioned several months ago, it turned out that we had a critical need to put on a new roof for more than 50% of our building as well as getting up to date our heating and cooling systems. So even though we are looking very good in the kitchen project and God willing we will have that up and running by the end of August/first part of September, we have had to spend a little more than \$60,000 to get everything done. So we are still in pretty good shape when it comes to our building fund with about \$50,000 left, but our next project will be to get those bathrooms looking more like they belong to this century as well as saving money for the roof over the church which will have to be replaced sometime in the next three years. So even though there is a lot more to do, praise God for the generosity of so many of you and praise God that we have a good, vibrant parish that is worth keeping up to date as far as the physical plans go. We will be presenting to the parish in the next few weeks a bulletin insert that will provide a summary of the financial activity of our parish over the past fiscal year which ended this past June. Thanks again for all of your prayers and support and may God continue to bless all of us here in our parish.

JULY—THE MONTH OF THE PRECIOUS BLOOD

Devotion to the Precious Blood is not spiritual option, it is a spiritual obligation, and that is not only for priests, but for every follower of Christ. I really believe that one of the symptoms of modern society (and I would even include, sadly, modern Catholic society) one of the symptoms of a growing, gnawing secularism is the lessening and the weakening of devotion to the Precious Blood. Devotion, as we know, is a composite of three elements: It is first- veneration, it is secondly- invocation, and it is thirdly- imitation. In other words, devotion to the Precious Blood of Christ, the Lamb of God who was slain, is first of all to be veneration on our part, which is a composite of knowledge, love and adoration. We are to study to come to a deeper understanding of what those two casual words, Precious Blood, really mean.



I found this passage in the oldest document, outside of sacred scripture, from the first century of the Christian era – to be exact, from Pope St. Clement I, dated about 96 A.D. Says Pope Clement: "Let us fix our gaze on the Blood of Christ and realize how truly precious It is, seeing that it was poured out for our salvation and brought the grace of conversion to the whole world."

To understand the meaning of the Precious Blood we must get some comprehension of the gravity of sin, of the awfulness of offending God, because it required the Blood of the Son of God to forgive that sin. We are living in an age in which to sin has become fashionable.

This veneration of the Precious Blood, which is the first element in our devotion to the Precious Blood means that we have a deep sensitivity to the awfulness of sin. Sin must be terrible. It must be awful. It must be the most dreadful thing in the universe. Why? Because it cost the living God in human form the shedding of His Blood.

Lord Jesus, You became Man in order by your Passion and Death and the draining of your Blood on the Cross, might prove to us how much You, our God, love us. Protect us, dear Jesus, from ever running away from the sight of blood. Strengthen our weak human wills so that we will not only not run away from the cross, but welcome every opportunity to shed our blood in spirit in union with your Precious Blood, so that, dying to ourselves in time we might live with You in Eternity. Amen
