So they brought the colt to Jesus and put their cloaks over it. And he sat on it. Many people spread their cloaks on the road, and others spread leafy branches that they had cut from the fields. - Mk 11:7-8

A MESSAGE FROM FR. DEPALMA

As we celebrate Palm Sunday and the start of Holy Week it is interesting that the main symbol for this day is the palm leaf. The palm branch is a symbol of victory, triumph, peace and eternal life, originating in the ancient Near East and the Mediterranean world. You could easily see how these meanings would fit our Lord Jesus as he rode into the city of Jerusalem with many people waving palm branches or throwing them down on the road as he entered. The problem though is that many of the people did not see him as the long awaited Messiah, but rather a political figure who could overthrow the Romans. Which is why it is very interesting what the people said to our Lord Jesus as he rode upon the colt with people singing praises to him. One of the things that the people cried out to him was "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest." "Hosanna" means either "help me" or when spoken with many others in a group, "deliver us." But one of the aspects of the word Hosanna is that it implies something immediate, so basically what the people are saying is "help me now", "deliver us now." On one hand that is exactly what our Lord was sent here to do, but to help us in what way? How is he going to deliver us? Not through any political means, but through the forgiveness of our sins. Jesus can help us now, and he most certainly can deliver us, but if we want to make this the best of Holy Weeks, we need to let our Lord deliver us from the things that truly hold us bound, our pride, our selfishness, our lustfulness, our anger and unforgiveness. Holding those palm leaves for those of you who will be with us this weekend, but even for those of you who only will be watching the live stream Mass, you have not only in your hand but in your heart what that palm leaf represents: the victory, the triumph and the peace of our Lord Jesus Christ, leading us to eternal life.

4 DAILY HABITS TO KEEP YOUR FAITH ALIVE

Nightly Examination
This is important and it helps prepare you for your next confession. It is healthy to examine your faults and failings and to ask God's help to overcome them.



Morning Offering
By praying a morning offering, you dedicate the rest of the day to God, which then prepares you to tackle anything that comes at you during the day.



15 minutes of Mental Prayer
It consists of a "heart-to-heart" with God and leaving time for talking and listening. God is extremely interested in what is going on in your life.



15 minutes of Spiritual Reading
One way to do this is to read the Gospel reading for today and then find a spiritual book that will help you grow in your relationship with God.

Why do Catholics cover crucifixes and statues during Holy Week?

Veils over sacred images keep our minds on the promise of Easter.

It seems strange that during the most sacred time of year Catholics cover everything that is beautiful in their churches, even the crucifix. Shouldn't we be looking at the painful scene at Calvary while we listen to the Passion narrative on Palm Sunday?

While it may appear counterintuitive to veil statues and images during the final weeks of Lent, the Catholic Church recommends this practice to heighten our senses and build within us a longing for Easter Sunday. It is a tradition that should not only be carried out in our local parish, but can also be a fruitful activity for the "domestic church" to practice.

The rubrics can guide us. In the *Roman Missal* we find the instruction, "In the Dioceses of the United States, the practice of covering crosses and images throughout the church from [the fifth] Sunday [of Lent] may be observed. Crosses remain covered until the end of the Celebration of the Lord's Passion on Good Friday, but images remain covered until the beginning of the Easter Vigil."

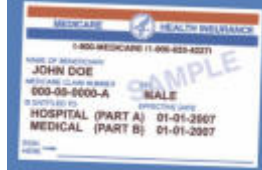
