## Sacraments

**Baptism:** English Baptisms will be officiated on the 2nd and 4th Sunday of the month at 1:30 PM in the Church. Spanish Baptisms will be officiated on the 1st and 3rd Sunday of the month at 1:30 PM in the Church.

Contact the Parish Office to schedule. Attendance at Baptism class is mandatory. The Baptism must be scheduled before you attend Baptism class.

**Marriage:** Weddings celebrated Saturdays and Friday evenings, but not Sundays. You must contact a priest 9 months before the planned date, and reservation of a wedding time is suggested even earlier.

**Confirmation, First Eucharist, First Penance:** Though immediate preparation is given before receiving these sacraments, children are expected to receive a Catholic upbringing in their families. This includes formal religious education classes and regular Sunday worship in the years prior to and following the reception of these Sacraments.

**Marian Novena:** Saturdays following 8:15 AM Mass in the Chapel.

**Eucharistic Adoration:** First and Second Friday, Adoration following 8:30 AM Mass; Benediction: 1st Friday in English; 2nd Friday in Spanish, 12:00 PM in the Chapel.

## Sponsorship Eligibility

### To be or not to be . . . A Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation

The opportunity to walk with another in Faith, whether a child or an adult is an awesome privilege. It is cause for serious consideration on the part of those who ask another to witness with their lives to what it means to be a Catholic, and for those who accept this responsibility. It is important to think carefully about your selection and decision. The person to be considered a Sponsor must be at least 14 years of age and have themselves completed the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation), and are leading a life in harmony with the Faith and Tradition they are called to witness. A Godparent/Sponsor cannot be the mother or father of the one to be baptized. If married, their marriage must be recognized as "valid" by the Catholic Church. They must be attending Mass regularly, that is, every Sunday and Holy Day of Obligation.

**They will need to obtain a Certificate of Eligibility signed by their pastor.** Being properly registered at one's parish is an important first step. Consider carefully your invitation and response. There is more involved to this than simply standing at the Baptismal Font. It is a lifelong commitment. If you have questions, speak with one of the parish priests who can guide you correctly. Call the Parish Office EARLY, even before your child's birth to obtain information that will help you in selecting suitable godparents.

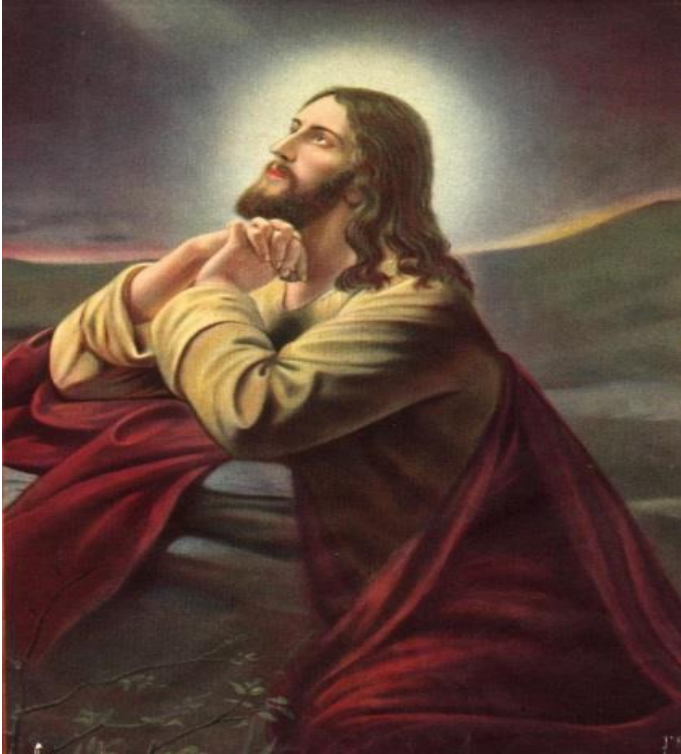

## Abortion and the Economy (Part II)

Last week, we highlighted the very low total fertility rates (TFR or children per female) throughout the western world and the strain this places on both a shrinking youth and the economy.

In the U.S., the TFR currently stands at 2.0. This is higher than European countries, Japan and China, thanks in large part to immigration (both legal and illegal). Yet, this figure is well below the figures experienced throughout our history when our economy was booming. The 2010 Census showed the slowest growth rates since the Great Depression.

The overall cost to our economy of each abortion is:

\* Total annual consumption of goods and services per abortion: \$36,234

\* Total annual taxes lost per abortion: \$12,440

\* Total annual loss to economy per abortion: \$48,674

Since Roe v. Wade in 1973, there have been around 56 million abortions. The total annual loss of 56 million abortions is over \$2,595,000,000,000. No wonder we have a Social Security and Medicaid problem, and this problem will only worsen as more baby boomers reach retirement and our inverted demographic pyramid becomes even more pronounced!

Of course, we can never put a price on a precious soul created by God, but one need not wonder why we are facing a global economic collapse.

Why are we funding Planned Parenthood each year to kill the soul of our nation and contribute to the fall of our economy? Is that not totally insane?

## El Aborto y la Economía (Parte 1)

Los niños son nuestro mayor recurso natural. Sin embargo, a través del mundo oeste, la natalidad ha decaído. En Europa, los principales países tales como Alemania, Italia, Francia, Grecia y la Gran Bretaña, en su totalidad tienen índices de natalidad (TFR o niños por mujer) bien abajo de 1.5.

El índice de natalidad del Japón está al fondo con 1.1 los países tienen un futuro incierto cuando la natalidad descende tanto. Económicamente, los problemas son obvios. Los gobiernos en Europa y Norte América han construido estados elaborados y con derechos generosos desde la Segunda Guerra Mundial.

Pero la población que avejenta y la pirámide invertida demográfica ponen una enorme responsabilidad en la juventud, causando significativa y al final presiones catastróficas en la bolsa pública. Nada más los Estados Unidos tiene \$100 trillones de deuda pública.
