Sacraments

Baptism: English Baptisms will be officiated on the 2nd and 4th Sunday of the month at 1:30 PM in the Church. Spanish Baptisms will be officiated on the 1st and 3rd Sunday of the month at 1:30 PM in the Church. Contact the Parish Office to schedule. Attendance at Baptism class is mandatory. The Baptism must be scheduled before you attend Baptism class.

Marriage: Weddings celebrated Saturdays and Friday evenings, but not Sundays. You must contact a priest 9 months before the planned date, and reservation of a wedding time is suggested even earlier.

Confirmation, First Eucharist, First

Penance: Though immediate preparation is given before receiving these sacraments, children are expected to receive a Catholic upbringing in their families. This includes formal religious education classes and regular Sunday worship in the years prior to and following the reception of these Sacraments.

Devotions

Marian Novena: Saturdays following 8:30 AM Mass in the Chapel.

Eucharistic Adoration:

- First Friday of the month from 9:00 AM - 12:00 PM, Benediction in English in the Chapel.

In the Hospital?

New Parishioners

New Parishioners are asked to come to the Parish Office and fill out a Census form. Individuals and families must be registered and practicing here for at least six months before applying for sponsorship.

Sponsorship Eligibility

To be or not to be . . . A Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation

The opportunity to walk with another in Faith, whether a child or an adult is an awesome privilege. It is cause for serious consideration on the part of those who ask another to witness with their lives to what it means to be a Catholic, and for those who accept this responsibility. It is important to think carefully about your selection and decision. The person to be considered a Sponsor must be at least 14 years of age and have themselves completed the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation), and are leading a life in harmony with the Faith and Tradition they are called to witness. A Godparent/Sponsor cannot be the mother or father of the one to be baptized. If married, their marriage must be recognized as "valid" by the Catholic Church. They must be attending Mass regularly, that is, every Sunday and Holy Day of Obligation.

They will need to obtain a Certificate of Eligibility signed by their pastor.

Being properly registered at one's parish is an important first step. Consider carefully your invitation and response. There is more involved to this than simply standing at the Baptismal Font. It is a lifelong commitment. If you have questions, speak with one of the parish priests who can guide you correctly. Call the Parish Office EARLY, even before your child's birth to obtain information that will help you in selecting suitable godparents.

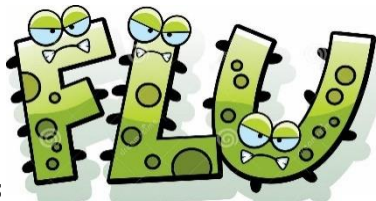

Most Precious Blood

During the month of February (and possibly longer), the Most Precious Blood will not be offered during Mass in an effort to reduce the spread of the flu virus.

Influenza and the Mass

Most experts believe that flu viruses spread mainly when infected people cough, sneeze or talk and droplets reach the nose or mouth of other people. Less



often, a person might also get the flu by touching a surface or object that has flu viruses on it, and then they touch their own mouth or nose. Since we are now in the flu season we remind ALL people to exercise good judgement and to stay home if you have the flu. This includes staying home on Sunday and missing mass rather than infecting others. If you are at church and feel you might be coming down with the flu or recovering from a recent bout, please refrain from shaking hands at the sign of peace and also from drinking the Precious Blood from the Communion Cup. We owe it to our fellow parishioners to be prudent and err on the side of caution, if in doubt. Thank you for your understanding and abiding by these suggestions.

Lenten Instructions

The days of fast and abstinence are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. All other Fridays are days of abstinence. From Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday until the celebration of the Easter Vigil on the evening of Holy Saturday, the Easter fast should be observed. Fast applies to Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59. Limit oneself to one full meal during the day so as to experience hunger. Abstinence applies to Catholics who have reached the age of 14. Abstain from meat. Obligation of fast and abstinence, as a whole, is a serious obligation. Those unable to abstain for a valid reason on any given Friday of Lent are asked to perform some other penitential act, or to abstain on another day.

Solemn Quiet During Lent

During Lent, please maintain the tradition of solemn quiet. Lent is a time of penance and reflection on the Mass, music and readings. Please refrain from any applause.

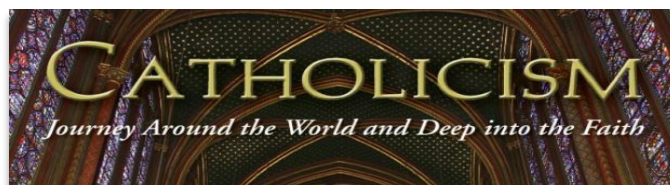

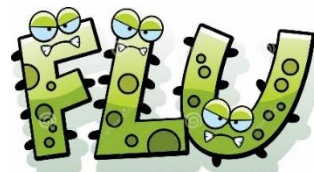

Prevención y Cuidado de su Salud

Febrero es el mes nacional del corazón. El sábado, 24 de febrero, **Life Line Screening** estará en la iglesia de Our Lady of Fátima (cafetería de la escuela), 501 New Market Rd. en Piscataway, ofrece cinco pruebas clave que controlan las arterias carótidas bloqueadas, un ritmo cardíaco irregular llamado fibrilación auricular, aórtica abdominales aneurismas, endurecimiento de las arterias en las piernas (PAD) y su riesgo de osteoporosis. Las proyecciones son precisas, no invasivas, sin dolor y no requieren que se desvista. Estas proyecciones van más allá de los chequeos regulares. Conocer sus factores de riesgo puede ayudarle a usted y a su médico a abordar los problemas temprano. Ser examinado es simple. Las proyecciones proporcionan paz mental o detección temprana. Hay 46 citas programadas. No es demasiado tarde para tomar el control de su salud.
