Due to the Coronavirus, the parish office will not be staffed until further. If you need to contact staff, please email or call and leave a message.

Sacraments *(Suspended until further notice)*

Penance: Please call the parish office for a private appointment Regularly scheduled confessions are suspended until further notice.

Baptism: English Baptisms will be officiated on the 2nd and 4th Sunday of the month at 1:30 PM in the Church.

Spanish Baptisms will be officiated on the 1st and 3rd Contact the Parish Office to schedule. Attendance at Baptism class is mandatory.

First Penance, First Eucharist and Confirmation:

Though immediate preparation is given before receiving these sacraments, children are expected to receive a Catholic upbringing in their families. This includes formal religious education classes and regular Sunday worship in the years prior to and following the reception of these Sacraments.

Marriage: Weddings are celebrated Friday evenings and Saturdays, but not Sundays. You must contact a priest nine months before the planned date, and reservation of a wedding time is suggested even earlier.

Devotions *(Suspended until further notice)*

Marian Novena: Saturdays following 8:30 AM Mass in the Chapel.

Eucharistic Adoration: First Friday of the month from 9 AM -12 PM, Benediction in English in the Chapel. Second Friday of the month from 6:30-8:30 PM, Benediction in Spanish in the Chapel.

In the Hospital?

If you or someone you know is sick in the hospital or nursing home for an extended stay, please contact the parish office. We will do our best to have someone make a pastoral visit and bring communion.

New Parishioners

New Parishioners are asked to come to the Parish Office and fill out a Census form. Individuals and families must be registered and practicing here for at least six months before applying for sponsorship.

If you have changed your address or other information, please contact the Parish Office at (732) 356-0027 so that we can update our records.

Sponsorship Eligibility

To be or not to be a Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation? It is important to think carefully about your selection and decision. The person to be considered a Sponsor must be at least 14 years of age and have themselves completed the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation), and are leading a life in harmony with the Faith and Tradition they are called to witness. A Godparent/Sponsor cannot be the mother or father of the one to be baptized. If married, their marriage must be recognized as "valid" by the Catholic Church. They must be attending Mass regularly, that is, every Sunday and Holy Days of Obligation. **They will need to obtain a Certificate of Eligibility signed by their pastor.** If you have questions, speak with a parish priest who can guide you correctly. Call the Parish Office early, even before your child's birth to obtain information that will help you in selecting suitable godparents.

The story that began with an infancy narrative and new beginnings now comes to a close with a narrative of death and rebirth.

The following will be adopted by St. Joseph Church in following the decree released by the Diocese of Metuchen for Holy Week and Triduum 2020 in time of COVID-19 Pandemic.

In light of further restrictions by Governor Murphy and the Decree of the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments by the Holy See, Bishop Checchio directs the following practices regarding the liturgies of Palm Sunday and Holy Week 2020 throughout the Diocese of Metuchen. As Bishop Checchio encourages us to continue to strive to engage in prayer during these days, he is also conscientious of the need to follow the guidelines of our state so as to hopefully hamper the spread of the virus to our faithful. We cannot risk endangering one another or our clergy. Therefore, religious activities that would encourage groups to gather at our churches are prohibited.

Palm Sunday

The Main Church will be open from 8:00 – 10:00 AM for private prayer. There will be no Masses or public gathering inside or outside the Church, in cars, etc. Blessed palms will be made available for distribution at St. Joseph Church at a later date.

The Mass for Palm Sunday will be celebrated by the Bishop without a congregation, with palms blessed, and broadcast via the live-stream internet on the Cathedral web site at <https://www.stfranciscathedral.org/> at 10:30 AM on Sunday, April 5, 2020.

Paschal Triduum

The following liturgical directives are to be observed in accordance with the “Decree in Time of COVID-19” issued on March 19, 2020 by mandate of the Holy Father for the year 2020 only.

Holy Thursday

There will be no Masses or public gathering inside or outside the Church, in cars, etc. Pastors are not permitted to open their churches on Holy Thursday. The Church will not be decorated with special altars for traditional visits. The risk is that larger groups will come at this time, raising the risk of spreading the virus. The Evening Mass of the Lord’s Supper will be celebrated by the Bishop without a congregation and broadcast via the live-stream internet on the Cathedral web site at <https://www.stfranciscathedral.org/> at 7:30 PM on Thursday, April 9, 2020.

Good Friday

The Main Church will be open from 4:00 – 6:00 PM for private prayer. There will be no Masses or public gathering inside or outside the Church, in cars, etc. The commemoration of the Lord’s Passion will be celebrated by the Bishop without a congregation and broadcast via the live-stream internet on the Cathedral web site at <https://www.stfranciscathedral.org/> at 3:00 PM on Friday, April 10, 2020.

Holy Saturday

The Main Church will be open from 5:00 – 7:00 PM for private prayer. There will be no Masses or public gathering inside or outside the Church, in cars, etc. The Easter Vigil will be celebrated by the Bishop without a congregation and broadcast via the live-stream internet on the Cathedral web site at <https://www.stfranciscathedral.org/> at 8:00 PM on Saturday, April 11, 2020.

The Rite of Christian Initiation and/or Reception into Full Communion will be postponed and re-scheduled once restrictions are lifted. More details will be provided at that time.

Easter Sunday

The Main Church will be open from 8:00 – 10:00 AM for private prayer. There will be no Masses or public gathering inside or outside the Church, in cars, etc. Mass for Easter Sunday will be celebrated by the Bishop without a congregation and broadcast via the live-stream internet on the Cathedral web site at <https://www.stfranciscathedral.org/> at 10:30 AM on Sunday, April 12, 2020.

At this time all public worship is suspended until further notice. We will continue to monitor the status of when masses and other services may begin again according to the directives from civil authorities.
