SACRAMENTS

Penance: Please call the parish office for a private appointment. Regularly scheduled confessions are suspended until further notice.

Baptism: English Baptisms will be officiated on the 2nd and 4th Sunday of the month at 1:30 PM in the Church.

Spanish Baptisms will be officiated on the 1st and 3rd

Contact the Parish Office to schedule. Attendance at Baptism class is mandatory.

First Penance, First Eucharist and Confirmation: Though immediate preparation is given before receiving these sacraments, children are expected to receive a Catholic upbringing in their families. This includes formal religious education classes and regular Sunday worship in the years prior to and following the reception of these Sacraments.

Marriage: Weddings are celebrated Friday evenings and Saturdays, but not Sundays. You must contact a priest nine months before the planned date, and reservation of a wedding time is suggested even earlier.

Marian Novena: Saturdays following 8:30 AM Mass in the Chapel.

Eucharistic Adoration: (resumes in September)
First Friday of the month from 9 AM -12 PM, Benediction in English in the Chapel. Second Friday of the month from 6:30-8:30 PM, Benediction in Spanish in the Chapel.

IN THE HOSPITAL?

If you or someone you know is sick in the hospital or nursing home for an extended stay, please contact the parish office. We will do our best to have someone make a pastoral visit and bring communion.

NEW PARISHIONERS

New Parishioners are asked to come to the Parish Office and fill out a Census form. Individuals and families must be registered and practicing here for at least six months before applying for sponsorship.

If you have changed your address or other information, please contact the Parish Office at (732) 356-0027 so that we can update our records.

SPONSORSHIP ELIGIBILITY

To be or not to be a Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation? It is important to think carefully about your selection and decision. The person to be considered a Sponsor must be at least 14 years of age and have themselves completed the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation), and are leading a life in harmony with the Faith and Tradition they are called to witness. A Godparent/Sponsor cannot be the mother or father of the one to be baptized. If married, their marriage must be recognized as “valid” by the Catholic Church. They must be attending Mass regularly, that is, every Sunday and Holy Days of Obligation. They will need to obtain a Certificate of Eligibility signed by their pastor. If you have questions, speak with a parish priest who can guide you correctly. Call the Parish Office early, even before your child’s birth to obtain information that will help you in selecting suitable godparents.

TODAY'S READINGS

MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST (CORPUS CHRISTI)

Reading I: Deuteronomy 8: 2-3, 14b-16a

The writer looks back to the past of his people and recalls the manna by which God fed His people. He concludes that "not by bread alone does one live," but by the Word of God.

Reading II: I Corinthians 10: 16-17

Our sharing in the one cup and one loaf of bread forges the unity that we believers have, and this sharing makes us one body.

The Gospel: John 6: 51-58

A relationship exists between the believer and Our Lord Jesus that is established by the Holy Eucharist. There is a sharp distinction between the community that possesses "the bread of life," and the ancients, who had only the manna.

RESTORATION OF PUBLIC MASSES

We have received the good news that we are able to once again celebrate Mass with a congregation. Weekday masses began in the Chapel this past week on Monday, June 8th. Mass in the chapel is limited to 10 people including the Celebrant.

Weekend masses begin with the Saturday vigil on June 13th. The schedule of masses will remain the same as it was before they were suspended by Executive Order. Mass attendees are expected to wash their hands at home and bring their own masks and hand sanitizer, which should be used upon entering the church. Face masks will be required for all except the very young. Social distancing will be required, and the number of attendees will be restricted to 50 people in the Main Church. We will not be able to allow people to enter the church once we have reached capacity. Future phases of the restoration of services will allow for a greater number of attendees.

Out of deep respect for human life and concern for the common good, those in vulnerable groups should stay home and those who are sick or symptomatic must stay home.

Understanding that every individual has their own concerns or is not able to return to Mass in person, Catholics in our diocese will continue to be dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass until further notice. No one will be required to physically attend Mass during this period of time. While the obligation to attend Mass is dispensed, you are encouraged to keep the Lord's Day holy by some other means. For example, you are encouraged to tune into a live-streamed Mass from a local parish within our diocese (www.diometuchen.org/parish-live-streams) or on TV.

CORPUS CHRISTI SUNDAY

Corpus Christi (Body and Blood of Christ) is a Eucharistic solemnity, or better, the solemn commemoration of the institution of that sacrament. It is, moreover, the Church's official act of homage and gratitude to Christ, who by instituting the Holy Eucharist gave to the Church her greatest treasure.

The Mass and the Office for the feast was edited or composed by St. Thomas Aquinas upon the request of Pope Urban IV in the year 1264.

In the words of St. Thomas:

"How inestimable a dignity, beloved brethren, divine bounty has bestowed upon us Christians from the treasury of its infinite goodness! For there neither is nor ever has been a people to whom the gods were so high as our Lord and God is high unto us.

"Desirous that we be made partakers of His divinity, the only-begotten Son of God has taken to Himself our nature so that having become man, He would be enabled to make men gods. Whatever He assumed of our nature He wrought unto our salvation. For on the altar of the Cross He immolated to the Father His own Body as victim for our reconciliation and shed His blood both for our ransom and for our regeneration. Moreover, in order that a remembrance of so great benefits may always be with us, He has left us His Body as food and His Blood as drink under appearances of bread and wine.

"O banquet most precious! O banquet most admirable! O banquet overflowing with every spiritual delicacy! Can anything be more excellent than this repast, in which not the flesh of goats and heifers, as of old, but Christ the true God is given us for nourishment? What more wondrous than this holy sacrament! In it bread and wine are changed substantially, and under the appearance of a little bread and wine is had Christ Jesus, God and perfect Man. In this sacrament sins are purged away, virtues are increased, the soul is satiated with an abundance of every spiritual gift. No other sacrament is so beneficial. Since it was instituted unto the salvation of all, it is offered by Holy Church for the living and for the dead, that all may share in its treasures.

"My dearly beloved, is it not beyond human power to express the ineffable delicacy of this sacrament in which spiritual sweetness is tasted in its very source, in which is brought to mind the remembrance of that all-excelling charity which Christ showed in His sacred passion? Surely it was to impress more profoundly upon the hearts of the faithful the immensity of this charity that our loving Savior instituted this sacrament at the last supper when, having celebrated the Pasch with His disciples. He was about to leave the world and return to the Father. It was to serve as an unending remembrance of His passion, as the fulfillment of ancient types — this the greatest of His miracles. To those who sorrow over His departure He has given a unique solace."

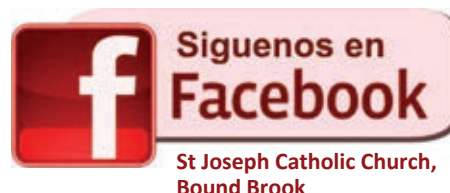
¿Qué diferencia hace en mi vida esta celebración semanal de la Eucaristía?

RESTAURACIÓN DE LAS MISAS PÚBLICAS

La restauración de las misas con una congregación se completará en un enfoque gradual, ya comenzamos con la celebración de misas entre semana con un número limitado de personas (10 o menos personas presentes), y este fin de semana ya en la fase 2 con la celebración de las misas de sábado y domingo (50 o menos personas presentes). Expertos en enfermedades infecciosas del Hospital de St. Peter's ayudaron a desarrollar nuestros procedimientos para la reanudación de la distribución de la comunión. Trabajamos para restaurar las misas con una congregación, lo haremos teniendo en cuenta la seguridad de todos los feligreses, clérigos, religiosos, personal de la parroquia y ministros laicos. Por lo tanto, siguiendo la guía de los funcionarios de salud, las áreas de alto uso dentro de la iglesia serán limpiadas con desinfectante antes y después de cada liturgia; Todos los libros de canto serán retirados y almacenados durante este tiempo.

El canto será limitado. Además, se alienta a los fieles a lavarse las manos en casa y traer sus propias máscaras y desinfectante para manos, que deben usarse al ingresar a la iglesia.

Se necesitarán máscaras faciales para todos excepto por los muy pequeños (los padres están en la mejor posición para determinar si su hijo es capaz de usar una máscara). Los ujieres escoltarán a la gente a los bancos, algunos bancos son para familias, otros son para individuos. Se requerirá distanciamiento social y se restringirá el número de asistentes. No podremos permitir que la gente entre en la iglesia una vez que hayamos alcanzado su capacidad. Las fases futuras de la restauración de los servicios permitirán un mayor número de asistentes. Por el profundo respeto por la vida humana y la preocupación por el bien común, los que están en grupos vulnerables deben permanecer en casa y los enfermos o sintomáticos deben quedarse en casa. Entendiendo que cada individuo tiene sus propias preocupaciones o no puede volver a la Misa en persona, los católicos en nuestra diócesis continuarán siendo dispensados de la obligación de asistir a la Misa hasta nuevo aviso. Nadie tendrá que asistir físicamente a la misa durante este período de tiempo. Si bien se dispensa la obligación de asistir a la Misa, se les alienta a santificar el Día del Señor por algún otro medio. Por ejemplo, se le anima a sintonizar una misa transmitida en vivo desde una parroquia local dentro de nuestra diócesis (www.diometuchen.org/parish-live-streams) o en TV.

Hoy celebramos la verdadera presencia de Cristo en la Eucaristía. He aquí algunas de las reflexiones que San Francisco de Sales hace en relación a este Sacramento. Después de la resurrección Jesús

entró en la habitación donde se habían reunido los apóstoles; aun cuando las puertas estaban cerradas con llave. Él quería asegurarles que seguía con vida y que permanecía entre ellos. De este mismo modo Jesús nos entrega Su cuerpo y Su sangre, transformados en pan y vino, para convencernos de que Su presencia entre nosotros es real. El punto máximo del amor de Dios por nosotros, un amor que se basa en la auto entrega, es manifestado en la Eucaristía. Cristo instituyó el sacramento de la Eucaristía para que la totalidad de la familia humana pudiese estar íntimamente ligada a Él.
