SACRAMENTS

Penance: Saturdays from 4:00 - 4:45 PM in the Main Church. Other times on request.

Baptism: English Baptisms will be officiated on the 2nd and 4th Sunday of the month at 1:30 PM in the Church.

Spanish Baptisms will be officiated on the 1st and 3rd Sunday in the Main Church.

Contact the Parish Office to schedule. Attendance at Baptism class is mandatory.

First Penance, First Eucharist and Confirmation: Though immediate preparation is given before receiving these sacraments, children are expected to receive a Catholic upbringing in their families. This includes formal religious education classes and regular Sunday worship in the years prior to and following the reception of these Sacraments.

Marriage: Weddings are celebrated Friday evenings and Saturdays, but not Sundays. You must contact a priest nine months before the planned date, and reservation of a wedding time is suggested even earlier.

Marian Novena: Saturdays following 8:30 AM Mass in the Chapel.

Eucharistic Adoration: (resumes in September)
First Friday of the month from 9 AM - 12 PM, Benediction in English in the Chapel. Second Friday of the month from 6:30-8:30 PM, Benediction in Spanish in the Chapel.

IN THE HOSPITAL?

If you or someone you know is sick in the hospital or nursing home for an extended stay, please contact the parish office. We will do our best to have someone make a pastoral visit and bring communion.

NEW PARISHIONERS

New Parishioners are asked to come to the Parish Office and fill out a Census form. Individuals and families must be registered and practicing here for at least six months before applying for sponsorship.

If you have changed your address or other information, please contact the Parish Office at (732) 356-0027 so that we can update our records.

SPONSORSHIP ELIGIBILITY

To be or not to be a Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation? It is important to think carefully about your selection and decision. The person to be considered a Sponsor must be at least 14 years of age and have themselves completed the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation), and are leading a life in harmony with the Faith and Tradition they are called to witness. A Godparent/Sponsor cannot be the mother or father of the one to be baptized. If married, their marriage must be recognized as "valid" by the Catholic Church. They must be attending Mass regularly, that is, every Sunday and Holy Days of Obligation. They will need to obtain a Certificate of Eligibility signed by their pastor. If you have questions, speak with a parish priest who can guide you correctly. Call the Parish Office early, even before your child's birth to obtain information that will help you in selecting suitable godparents.

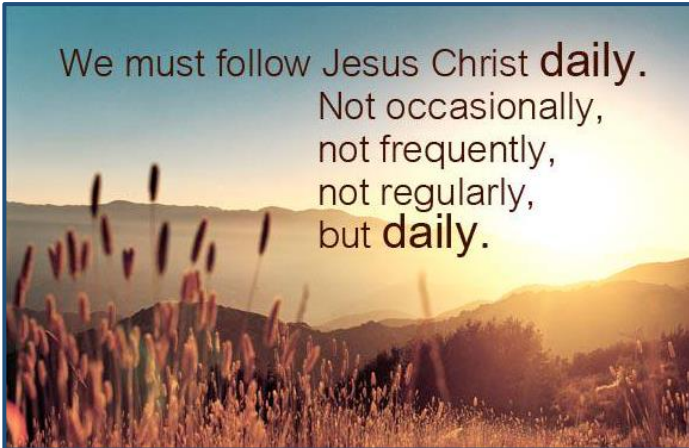

TODAY'S READINGS

THIRTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Reading I: 2 Kings 4: 8-11, 14-16 a

This story of the Shunite woman who offered hospitality to the prophet Elisha became part of the legends of the people. Her reward for her hospitality is the promise of a son, thus removing her shame.

Reading II: Romans 6: 3-4, 8-11

Paul teaches his readers how the new Christian life brings a certain kind of freedom from the old self through a new union with Christ. Baptism is the key, because it identifies us with Christ's death and resurrection, transforming us from within and changing our conduct.

The Gospel: Matthew 10: 37-42

How we react to Christ determines our future destiny regarding salvation. Just as Jesus represented His Father, so succeeding Christian ministers represent Jesus. Our ultimate fate is linked to how we receive them. God rewards even a cup of water given to the lowly among us.

We are happy to announce that we have settled a new date for the Sacraments of First Communion and Confirmation at our parish that were postponed from Spring! Religious Education Registrations 2020-21

Registration for the 2020-2021 Religious Education school year is now open. Families are required to register to enroll children into religious education classes for the 2020-2021 school year. Registration forms are available on our website www.sjccb.net > Religious Education > Faith Formation and in the Parish Office. Complete registrations along with payment can be mailed to our Parish Office. Payment may be made by cash or checks made payable to *St Joseph Church*.

RESTORATION OF PUBLIC MASSES

We are once again able to celebrate public Mass with a congregation. Weekend masses celebrated in the main church are limited to 100 people, and weekday masses celebrated in the Chapel are limited to 10 people including the Celebrant. We will not be able to allow people to enter the church once we have reached capacity. Future phases of the restoration of services will allow for a greater number of attendees.

Mass attendees are expected to wash their hands at home and bring their own masks and hand sanitizer, which should be used upon entering the church. Face masks are required for all except the very young. Social distancing is required.

Those in vulnerable groups should stay home, and those who are sick or symptomatic must stay home. Understanding that every individual has their own concerns or is not able to return to Mass in person, Catholics in our diocese will continue to be dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass until further notice. While the obligation to attend Mass is dispensed, you are encouraged to keep the Lord's Day holy by some other means, such as tune into a live-streamed Mass at St. Joseph Church or another local parish within our diocese (www.diometuchen.org/parish-live-streams).

SAINTS PETER AND PAUL'S STORY

The New Testament clearly shows Peter as the leader of the apostles, chosen by Jesus to have a special relationship with him. And to Peter only did Jesus say, "Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah. For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my heavenly Father. And so I say to you, you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it. I will give you the keys to the kingdom of heaven. Whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven; and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven" (Matthew 16:17b-19). But the Gospels prove their own trustworthiness by the unflattering details they include about Peter. He generously gave up all things, yet he can ask in childish self-regard, "What are we going to get for all this?" (see Matthew 19:27). He receives the full force of Christ's anger when he objects to the idea of a suffering Messiah: "Get behind me, Satan! You are an obstacle to me. You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings do" (Matthew 16:23b). Peter is willing to accept Jesus' doctrine of forgiveness, but suggests a limit of seven times. He walks on the water in faith, but sinks in doubt. He refuses to let Jesus wash his feet, then wants his whole body cleansed. He swears at the Last Supper that he will never deny Jesus, and then swears to a servant maid that he has never known the man. He loyally resists the first attempt to arrest Jesus by cutting off Malchus' ear, but in the end he runs away with the others. In the depth of his sorrow, Jesus looks on him and forgives him, and he goes out and sheds bitter tears. The Risen Jesus told Peter to feed his lambs and his sheep (John 21:15-17).

Paul (d. 64?) If the most well-known preacher today suddenly began preaching that the United States should adopt Marxism and not rely on the Constitution, the angry reaction would help us understand Paul's life when he started preaching that Christ alone can save us. He had been the most pharisaic of Pharisees, the most legalistic of Mosaic lawyers. Now he suddenly appears to other Jews as a heretical welcomer of Gentiles, a traitor and apostate. Paul's central conviction was simple and absolute: Only God can save humanity. No human effort—even the most scrupulous observance of law—can create a human good which we can bring to God as reparation for sin and payment for grace. To be saved from itself, from sin, from the devil, and from death, humanity must open itself completely to the saving power of Jesus. Paul never lost his love for his Jewish family, though he carried on a lifelong debate with them about the uselessness of the Law without Christ. He reminded the Gentiles that they were grafted on the parent stock of the Jews, who were still God's chosen people, the children of the promise.

RESTAURACIÓN DE LAS MISAS PÚBLICAS



La restauración de las misas con una congregación se completará en un enfoque gradual, de acuerdo con la orden ejecutiva. La celebración de la misa entre semana

en la Capilla con un número limitado de 10 personas incluido el celebrante, la celebración de las misas de sábado y domingo en la iglesia seguirá siendo en el mismo horario de antes de que fueran suspendidas. Se requerirá distanciamiento social, y el número de asistentes estará restringido a 100 personas en la Iglesia Principal. No podremos permitir que la gente entre en la iglesia una vez que hayamos alcanzado su capacidad. Las fases futuras de la restauración de los servicios permitirán un mayor número de asistentes. Se espera que los asistentes a la misa se laven las manos en casa y traigan sus propias máscaras y desinfectante de manos, que deben usarse al entrar en la iglesia. Se necesitarán máscaras faciales para todos excepto por los muy pequeños (los padres están en la mejor posición para determinar si su hijo/a es capaz de usar una máscara). Los ujieres escoltarán a la gente a los bancos, algunos bancos son para familias, otros son individuales. Expertos en enfermedades infecciosas del Hospital de St. Peter's ayudaron a desarrollar nuestros procedimientos para la reanudación de la distribución de la comunión. Trabajamos para restaurar las misas teniendo en cuenta la seguridad de todos los feligreses, clérigos, religiosos, personal de la parroquia y ministros laicos. Por lo tanto, siguiendo la guía de los funcionarios de salud, las áreas de alto uso dentro de la iglesia serán limpiadas con desinfectante antes y después de cada liturgia; todos los libros de canto serán retirados y almacenados durante este tiempo. El canto será limitado.

Los que están en grupos vulnerables deben permanecer en casa y los enfermos o sintomáticos deben quedarse en casa. Entendiendo que cada individuo tiene sus propias preocupaciones o no puede volver a la Misa en persona, los católicos en nuestra diócesis continuarán siendo dispensados de la obligación de asistir a la Misa hasta nuevo aviso. Nadie tendrá que asistir físicamente a la misa durante este período de tiempo. Si bien se dispensa la obligación de asistir a la Misa, se les alienta a santificar el Día del Señor por algún otro medio. Por ejemplo, se le anima a sintonizar una misa transmitida en vivo desde una parroquia local dentro de nuestra diócesis (www.diometuchen.org/parish-live-streams) o en TV.

SAN PEDRO Y SAN PABLO

El día de *San Pedro y San Pablo* conmemora la vida de estos dos apóstoles. Ellos ofrecieron su vida por Cristo y gracias a su actividad misionera el cristianismo se extendió rápidamente por el Imperio Romano. Pedro es conocido como el



apóstol apasionado, pero frágil espiritualmente. Fue el hombre elegido por Jesús para ser la roca de la Iglesia: Tú eres Pedro y sobre esta piedra edificaré mi Iglesia (Mateo 16, 16). Guardó con celo y devoción su misión hasta entregar su vida como mártir. Pablo, era culto, con formación rabínica, conocedor del pensamiento grecolatino. Él pasó de ser un perseguidor a un apóstol del cristianismo. Su misión fue fundamental porque desligó el cristianismo de la ley judía. Por esto los apóstoles son considerados las dos columnas de la fe cristiana. El sentido más profundo de esta festividad es confesar solemnemente el credo de la Iglesia: una, santa, católica y apostólica. Se celebra cada 29 de junio.
