SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

Infant/Child Baptism: Baptism is our incorporation into the Body of Christ and the foundation of our sacramental life. Contact Ana Valencia at the parish center to begin the process of instruction and celebration.

Children's Penance/Eucharist/Confirmation: Preparation for these sacraments of initiation are handled within our Faith Formation program. For questions, contact Ana Valencia.

Adult Initiation: The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is the path for those seeking to learn more and perhaps ask for full initiation into the Catholic church. A related process is available for those adults who only need to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation. For initial questions, contact any clergy person of the parish.

SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

Penance: this Sacrament is celebrated Saturday from 4:00-4:30pm in the Church. Other times are available by making an appointment with parish priests.

Anointing of the Sick: freely offered to those who are sick, facing surgery, those with chronic mental or emotional illness, and those of advanced age. In the Covid-19 era, there are certain conditions that prevent clergy from home visits and hospitals, but we are exploring ways to make the sacrament more widely available for at-risk parishioners on a regular basis.

SACRAMENTS OF SERVICE

Christian Marriage: Congratulations and blessings on your engagement. Every couple has unique gifts and needs, and our clergy will walk and work with you to meet our own time-tested standards to get you to the altar and beyond.

Holy Orders: If you are sensing God's call to service as a priest or deacon in the church, contact our pastor and/or any parish team member you feel can best serve you. Similarly, even though there are no sacraments associated with the religious life, monastic life, lay ministry or faith-based humanitarian service, please contact us if we can help you in your discernment.

DEVOTIONS

First Friday Mass in Time of Pandemic: Starting Friday, October 2 and continuing for every First Friday of the Month, the parish will offer a bilingual "Mass in Time of Pandemic" at 7:00 PM.

First and Last Friday Eucharistic Adoration: Starting Friday, October 2 and continuing every First Friday morning of the month, Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will run from 9:00 AM - Noon in the church. Starting Friday, October 30 and continuing for every Last Friday of the month, an evening Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will be offered from 5:00 PM - 7:00 PM. The language of Adoration is "Silence."

Monthly St. Sharbel Healing Mass: Starting Thursday, October 22 at 7:00 PM and continuing every 22nd of the month, a bilingual healing Mass will be offered, focusing on the intercession of St. Sharbel, the hermit of Lebanon, who is the subject of increasing devotion throughout the world.

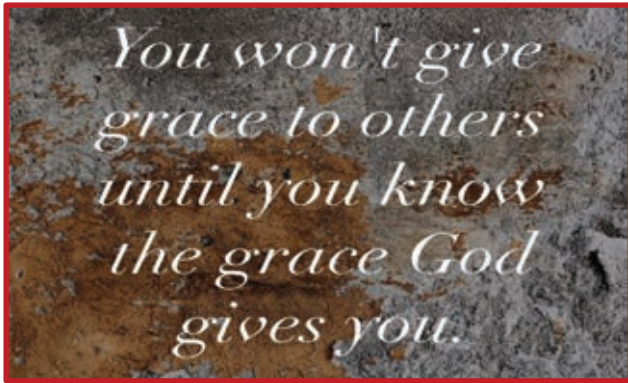

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

"For if we live, we live for the Lord, and if we die, we die for the Lord; so then, whether we live or die, we are the Lord's." (Romans 14:8)

This is the essence of stewardship – everything we have and everything we are is a gift from God. We aren't "owners" of anything, we are merely "stewards" of the gifts that God has given us, especially our very own lives. Pray to God daily and ask Him how He is calling you to live the life that He intended for you.

TODAY'S READINGS

TWENTY-FOURTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Reading I: Sirach 27: 30 – 28: 7

This section of the Israelite Wisdom literature matches the Christian imperative. It certainly is our duty to forgive others, and not to hold grudges or to hate one's neighbor.

Reading II: Romans 14: 7-9

The liberating act of Christ, by way of which He freed us from bondage to sin and death, has enabled us to live for God. That is the basis of life in a Christian society.

The Gospel: Matthew 18: 21-35

This instructional parable, with its three "acts," teaches us first that God's patience is a gift to us, and also that we have an obligation to imitate God's mercy by our forgiving attitude.

The Parish Community of St. Joseph welcomes our new Pastor, Rev. Msgr. Joseph Kerrigan, and our new Parochial Vicar, Rev. Lukasz Blicharski. Their e-mail addresses are the preferred and easiest means of communication.

Msgr. Kerrigan intends to be an active daily participant in parish and community life. He has no outside ministerial or personal commitments, except occasional check-ins and care of his elderly parents. He is not planning to take a day off nor a vacation for at least the duration of the Covid-19 public health emergency, health permitting.

In this initial period of servant leadership, our pastor is focusing on the coherence and formation of the pastoral team, along with evaluating all aspects of parish life, especially spiritual development, finances, faith formation and charity.

Fr. Blicharski will take Friday afternoon through Saturday morning as his off-service time. He will almost always be the priest for the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, due to the pastor's age and underlying health conditions. As his language proficiency develops, he is expected to join the Spanish Mass rotation. Again, e-mail is the best way to reach Fr. Blicharski.

RESTORATION OF PUBLIC MASSES

COMING PARISH-WIDE EVENTS

1) PASTOR'S CHAPTER TALKS

Drawing from the ancient monastic tradition of the abbot/abbess addressing fellow monastics in spiritual matters in the "chapter room," our pastor will use our church on selected Tuesdays and Thursdays this month for the same purpose. The hope is that we begin to develop a common parish-wide spiritual vision and to acquire new tools to strengthen our inner lives.

The schedule and themes are as follows:

Tuesday, September 15:

Developing a Distinct Parish and Personal Daily Rhythm.

How can fixed times of prayer be beneficial to your personal and parish life?

Thursday, September 17: Liturgy of the Hours.

How can the church's official daily "office" be beneficial to you at home and an exercise of solidarity in church?

Tuesday, September 22 (held outside):

Prayer Service to Mark the First Day of Autumn.

How can we expand our grateful care for our planet, our common home?

Thursday, September 24: What is Contemplative Prayer?

How can age-old monastic prayer methods complement our current prayer practices?

Tuesday, September 29: From Prayer to Action.

In these chaotic times, a sustained parish-wide response is needed to assist at least some of the poorest among us. Discernment prayer is the first step.

Each talk begins at 7:00 PM, will be presented in interwoven English and Spanish, and will end no later than 7:45 PM with the official Night Prayer of the church.

2) SAVE THE DATE: NOON "GREEN" MASS OCTOBER 1

Trying to determine whether there is interest in an annual diocesan "Green Mass" to celebrate the Season of Creation, our pastor and Tony Varas, director of the Office of Worship for the Diocese, are planning an outdoor "Green Mass" at noon Thursday, October 1 in front of the church. At the Mass, a new tree will be blessed on the parish grounds. Earth-caring enthusiasts (gardeners, environmental teams) from other parishes are being invited. In case of rain, the Mass will be inside.

3) OCTOBER EXPERIMENTAL EVENING SCHEDULE

Starting Thursday, October 1, a new experimental and *a la carte* evening church schedule will begin. **Most importantly, we will introduce a 7:00 PM Mass in Spanish that will run from Monday-Friday as long as parishioner demand warrants the Mass.** Parishioners can also choose to come at 6:00pm Monday-Friday for a 20-minute period of silent contemplative prayer led by Msgr. Kerrigan. At 6:30pm, the evening prayer of the church, "Vespers," will be conducted in Spanish.

Parishioners are invited to attend one, two or all three of the services; they are separate events. But parishioners are also advised to enter (main center) door and exit (side doors) in the same uni-directional pattern that we use for Mass.
