SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

Infant/Child Baptism: Baptism is our incorporation into the Body of Christ and the foundation of our sacramental life. Contact Ana Valencia at the parish center to begin the process of instruction and celebration.

Children's Penance/Eucharist/Confirmation: Preparation for these sacraments of initiation are handled within our Faith Formation program. For questions, contact Ana Valencia.

Adult Initiation: The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is the path for those seeking to learn more and perhaps ask for full initiation into the Catholic church. A related process is available for those adults who only need to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation. For initial questions, contact any clergy person of the parish.

SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

Penance: this Sacrament is celebrated Saturday from 4:00-4:30pm in the Church. Other times are available by making an appointment with parish priests.

Anointing of the Sick: freely offered to those who are sick, facing surgery, those with chronic mental or emotional illness, and those of advanced age. In the Covid-19 era, there are certain conditions that prevent clergy from home visits and hospitals, but contact Fr. Blicharski at the parish if you would like the sacrament and we can determine if we can celebrate it safely.

SACRAMENTS OF SERVICE

Christian Marriage: Congratulations and blessings on your engagement. Every couple has unique gifts and needs, and our clergy will walk and work with you to meet our own time-tested standards to get you to the altar and beyond. Contact anyone on the pastoral team.

Holy Orders: If you are sensing God's call to service as a priest or deacon in the church, contact our pastor and/or any parish team member you feel can best serve you.

Similarly, even though there are no sacraments associated with the religious life, monastic life, lay ministry or faith-based humanitarian service, please contact us if we can help you in your discernment.

DEVOTIONS

First Friday Mass in Time of Pandemic: For every First Friday of the Month, the parish will offer a bilingual "Mass in Time of Pandemic" at 7:00 PM. Next: November 6.

First and Last Friday Eucharistic Adoration: Every First Friday morning of the month, Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will run from 9:00 AM - Noon in the church. Starting Friday, October 30 and continuing for every Last Friday of the month, an evening Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will be offered from 5:00 PM - 7:00 PM. The language of Adoration is "Silence."

Monthly St. Sharbel Healing Mass: Every 22nd of the month, a bilingual healing Mass will be offered, focusing on the intercession of St. Sharbel, the hermit of Lebanon, who is the subject of increasing devotion throughout the world for his intercessory popularity with healing.

Next St. Sharbel Healing Mass: Monday, November 23 at 7:00 PM.

Marian Devotion: first Friday Angelus, 12 noon monthly, at the conclusion of Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.

RESTORATION OF PUBLIC MASSES

As of September 1, 2020, all Masses — weekend and daily — are in the main church. Church capacity is limited to 150 people. Mass attendees are expected to sanitize their hands, wear masks and sit six feet apart. Those in vulnerable groups should stay home, and those who are sick or symptomatic must stay home. Catholics in our diocese will continue to be dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass until further notice.

TODAY'S READINGS

Reading I: Revelation 7: 2-4, 9-14

Here we have two distinct visions of John. In the first, 144,000 are observed "sealed on the forehead" with God's name for their fidelity to Him. In the second, an uncountable group from all nations wear white robes cleansed in the Lamb's Blood and they hoist the palm frond of victory.

Reading II: I John 3: 1-3

This is an exhortation to the Johannine community that God's love for them makes them "children of God." They sing in response, because they believe they will become divinized. They also believe that God demands of them that they be as pure as possible.

The Gospel: Matthew 5: 1-12a

The famous "Sermon on the Mount," encompassing the next two chapters in Matthew, begins with Jesus' eight beatitudes. A beatitude is defined as "an exclamation of congratulations that recognizes an existing state of happiness."

A MATTER OF QUESTIONS

RCIA Do Catholics believe that saints should be worshiped? Why do Catholics pray to saints? Is there a difference between prayer and worship? Do saints have extraordinary powers – like helping you to find lost articles?

Why do Catholics pray to "dead people"? Aren't we supposed to pray only to God? Why do Catholics pray before statues and paintings of saints? Isn't that worshipping idols? Very often people who are thinking about becoming part of the Catholic faith have questions such as these. Understanding the answer to the questions often helps in trying to make a decision. If you, or someone you know, is thinking about becoming Catholic, but would like some questions answered – that's what we do in our RCIA Inquiry Sessions.

PARISH EVENING SCHEDULE

Starting October 1, a new experimental and *a la carte* evening parish prayer schedule has begun. **We have introduced a 7:00 PM Mass in Spanish that will run from Monday-Friday as long as parishioner demand warrants the Mass; currently we are averaging 20 people.** Parishioners can also choose to come at 6:00 PM Monday-Friday for a 20-minute period of silent contemplative prayer led by Msgr. Kerrigan or other clergy. At 6:30 PM, the evening prayer of the church, "Vespers," will be conducted in Spanish.

Parishioners are invited to attend one, two or all three of the services; they are separate events. But parishioners are also advised to enter (main center) door and exit (side doors) in the same uni-directional pattern that we use for Mass.

First Quarter Financial Year 2021 records are in: St. Joseph experienced a **\$113,209 operating deficit** for the months July-August-September. This is a \$23,776 deeper deficit than at this point last year.

A large part of this deeper deficit: decreased Sunday collections. **July-September 2019: \$64,067; July-September 2020: \$48,456.**

Also declining: Wedding/Baptism/Candle/Funeral revenue: \$6,745 (2019); \$1,895 (2020).
