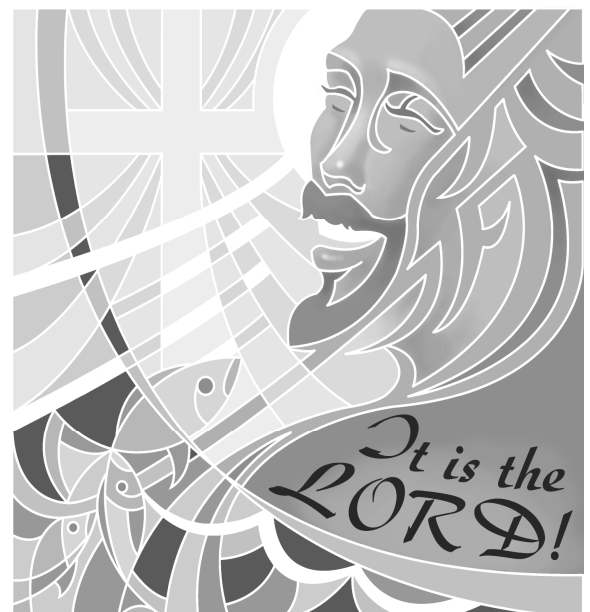

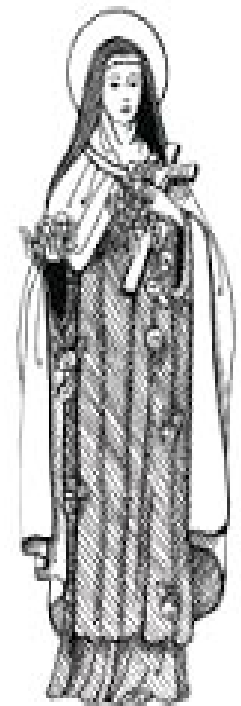

Do you remember Peter on the night Jesus was arrested? He claimed he had never heard of Jesus. Today we are called to join Peter in testifying to the name of Jesus as he does in the first reading, and in proclaiming our love for him as Peter does in the Gospel passage. The powerful imagery of John's vision in the second reading from the book of Revelation shows us the company we keep when we have faith in the name of Jesus. We join all living creatures, "countless in number" from "heaven, earth, under the earth, in the sea; everything in the universe" (Revelation 5:11, 13). The dignity and majesty described in each reading are in stark contrast to the dark and pitiful image of Peter and the other apostles at the time of Jesus' arrest, trial, and crucifixion. Bulletin reflection for the Third Sunday of Easter

Easter season is upon us, and accompanying it are majestic and mysterious excerpts from Sacred Scripture such as the second reading this Third Sunday of Easter from the Book of Revelation.

The Book of Revelation was composed using symbolic and coded language by a man imprisoned and exiled for his faith on the Island of Patmos in the Aegean Sea named John. While traditionally attributed to the Apostle John, there is strong debate among scripture scholars as to whether John of Patmos and the Apostle are one and the same person. In any event, with rich and vivid imagery, John of Patmos delivers a message of encouragement and hope to Christians who were enduring great persecution for their faith.

Here we are ushered by the author into a fantastic glimpse of the triumphant Son of God amidst the Heavenly Hosts of Angels and before the awesome majesty of the throne of God. And recalling the vision of Isaiah, the great prophet of Israel, the angelic hosts and the four living creatures representing the testimony of the four evangelists, Matthew, Mark, Luke and John, jubilantly cry out "Worthy is the Lamb that was slain to receive power and riches, wisdom and strength, glory and honor and blessing."

Amid the turmoil of his day and of his situation of imprisonment and exile, the human author, inspired by God's Holy Spirit, was able to transcend the limitations of the darkness of present reality to offer to us all through symbolic imagery the big picture of indescribable, inexhaustible heaven, God's Eternal Now.

Easter season is a time to celebrate the redemption Christ has wrought for us. As we reflect upon this passage's portal into the "not yet" which awaits all those purchased by the blood of the Lamb, and found faithful to Him in the end, may we, too, cry out in response: "To the one who sits on the throne and to the Lamb be blessing and honor, glory and might, forever and ever."
