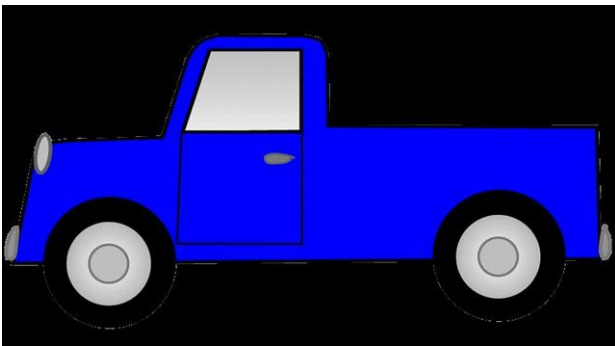


5th Grade Happenings

The school year may be coming to an end, but things are as busy as ever in the 5th grade classroom. God's grace to us has been the focus in theology. A few weeks ago the class took the diocesan theology test. This test covers material from kindergarten up to current 5th grade. They did well on the test. We will be ending our division chapter in math and moving into fractions. In language arts we have been studying the different types of adjectives. We just ended our poetry lesson in reading. We looked at the parts of a poem, rhyme scheme, types of figurative language, and different types of poems. The class has been investigating motion in science. They will use the information they are learning to construct their egg drop project. Their challenge is to construct a device as light as possible to keep an egg from breaking after being dropped from a top story window at the school. The egg drop takes place on May 28th at 2:00. The 5th graders have definitely been busy in the classroom, but they also have some events coming up outside of the classroom. Safety Patrol members will be going to the Soaring Eagle Water Park as a thank you for their services. Finally, we will be taking our end of the year field trip to the Air Zoo.
