Kindergarten students have learned about Architecture and what an Architects job is. Together we read the book Roberto The Insect Architect by Nina Laden. Students then became architects creating the ultimate tree house. First and second grade students have just finished up their lesson on the Chinese New Year creating their own Chinese Dragons, a simple of wisdom and good luck in the Chinese community. Students are now traveling to Australia working on art inspired by the Aboriginal People. Third and fourth grade students have just finished up their lesson on the great Beatrix Potter author, and illustrator of Peter Rabbit. Students created their own animals with human characteristics just like the famous Peter Rabbit. Students learned how to paint using markers creating pie eating rabbits to disco dancing squirrels.
