‘THE GOD OF ABRAHAM GUIDES MY STEPS AND NEVER ABANDONS ME,’ SAYS POPE AT GENERAL AUDIENCE.

Trust in the Holy Spirit, ‘who is Lord and gives life’ and be open to his love so you can transform your life, families and communities.

The God of Abraham guides my steps and never abandons me.

Pope Francis stressed this during his General Audience in his papal library as he focused on prayer, specifically on the prayer of Abraham.

In his remarks, Francis exhorted faithful to learn from Abraham’s example “how to pray with faith,” namely how “to listen, to journey, to converse and even argue with God, but always prepared to welcome the word and put it into practice.”

In the life of our “father in faith”, we see a new way of relating to God. Abraham hears the voice of God and trusts in his word and promises.

“In obedience to the Divine Word,” Abraham, the Jesuit Pope pointed out, leaves his former life behind to journey wherever God leads him even to the ultimate test of being asked to sacrifice his own son, Isaac.

Being so faithful to God, Francis said Abraham becomes a member of God’s family, “capable even of arguing with him, but always faithful.”

Abraham’s obedience to the Word, the Pope observed, marks a radically new step in the religious development of man.

Reflecting on how we have a personal call to live one’s life in fulfillment of God’s promises, Francis says: “The God of Abraham, the, becomes “my God”, the Lord of my own history who guides my steps and never abandons me.”

A few weeks ago the Pontiff began a new series of catecheses on prayer, and last week reflected on the mystery of creation.

Greeting the Italian-speaking faithful, Francis recalled that the upcoming feast of the Holy Trinity “bring us back to the mystery of the intimate life of the One and Triune God, the center of the Christian faith and stimulates us to find our comfort and inner peace in the love of God.”

Addressing elderly, young people, the sick and newlyweds, the Pope gave words of comfort.

“Trust in the Holy Spirit, ‘who is Lord and gives life’ and be open to his love so you can transform your life, your families and your communities.” He then gave them his blessing.
