Orientation Schedule:

PreK 3: Students will be welcomed in school on September 1, 2020: 9:00am-12:00pm.

PreK 4: Students will be welcomed in school on September 1 through the 4, 5 per day from 9:00am-11:00am. Kindergarten: Students will be welcomed to school individually to meet with their teachers. Grade Eight: Students will be welcomed to school on Thursday, September 3, 2020 from 10:00am-12:00pm. Students will be spaced out throughout all middle school classrooms for small groups. Students are welcome to bring all their materials for classes on this day.

Please have your student bring all their supplies with them to their orientation so that they will not be carrying too many things in on the first day of school. Please understand that parents will not be allowed in the building at this time as we continue to limit the amount of people in our building.

If you are choosing the virtual academy option for your student and have not already notified Dr. Amodie via email, please do so before August 26. The teacher for your student will be in contact with you regarding the schedule for virtual classes, login information etc. Additionally, virtual academy students are welcome to join our small orientation classes if possible. It would be great for students to meet their teachers in person before they meet them on screen.
