A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners:

With the Christmas Season behind us now, we are back in Ordinary Time until Ash Wednesday on February 14th. Ordinary Time sounds so "ordinary", but our lives are anything but ordinary after what we celebrated at Christmas and what we will celebrate at Faster.

"Behold the Lamb of God." These are the words of John the Baptist in today's Gospel as he points out Jesus. Two of John's disciples immediately followed Jesus, and Jesus turns to them and asks, "What are you looking for?" They respond, "Master where are you staying?" And Jesus invites them to "Come and you will see." Bishop Fulton Sheen used to say that the first word Jesus spoke to His disciples was "Come," and the last word was "Go." Before they could go out and preach the Gospel to all nations, they first had to come to Jesus, to stay with Him, to learn from Him, and come to know and love Him. And once they came to know Jesus they could not help but go out and share Him with others. That is what we are all called to do.

Every human heart, whether one realizes it or not, has a deep down desire for God. But the truth is that God desires us even more. St. Mother Theresa would say that God thirsts for our souls, for our faith, and for our love. As St. John so beautifully put it in His Gospel: "God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, so that we would not perish in our sins, but might have eternal life in Him." That is what Christmas and Easter is all about. That is how infinitely valuable each and every human soul is to God.

This is what stands behind the Church's relentless defense of human life from the moment of conception in the womb to natural death and at every point in between. This is why on Friday of this week, January 19th, hundreds of thousands of people from all over the world will descend upon Washington, D.C. for a peaceful and prayerful "March for Life" to mark the 45th anniversary of "Roe vs. Wade," the Supreme Court decision which made abortion a constitutional right in our great Nation. In the words of Pope Francis: "Every unborn child, condemned unjustly to being aborted, has the face of the Lord...they are conceived in His image and likeness...they cannot be discarded!" All of us in the Church are asked to observe this sad anniversary as a day of prayer and

penance for an end to abortion and for healing for those suffering from having an abortion. If you cannot make the March in Washington, please try to stop into the Church at some time during the day on Friday after the 9:00am Mass to pray before the Blessed Sacrament, and join us at 3:00pm for the Chaplet of Divine Mercy, Rosary for Life, and Benediction. May the prayers and witness of so many bring about a change in mind and heart in our leaders and in all the people of this great Nation. For every human life from the very moment of conception in the womb is an image of God, is loved by God, and is intended by God to live forever. May God bless us all.
