# FROM OUR PRIESTS' DESKS

Dear Brothers and Sisters of Sacred Heart:

- "Who do people say that I am?" That was the question Jesus asked his disciples in today's Gospel (Mk 8: 27-35). It is the same question he asks of every believer: "Who do you say that I am?" Of course, today, as in his own day, there are many different opinions about Jesus. Was he just an ordinary man with a beautiful moral code about how we should live our lives? Was he a magician and practitioner of the occult like so many in his own time, who was misunderstood and misrepresented by the Church as having supernatural powers? Was he an apostate from his own Jewish faith who wanted to start his own religion? Was he a clever fraud who staged his own death and resurrection and tricked people into believing he was the Son of God? Unless we are solidly anchored in our faith, we may find ourselves pulled in different directions, back and forth, depending on the prevailing opinion of Jesus in popular culture: a culture that tries to make Jesus as relevant or controversial as possible, the better to try to control him and cut him down to size to fit our own expectations and needs. The fact is that the real Jesus is a mystery who escapes our categories and descriptions; he can make us uncomfortable because he challenges us with his notions of taking up our cross, telling us to love our enemies, or stating that the last will be first.
- The path of humility, of perseverance in prayer, and the transforming power of suffering are the paths to true knowledge of who Jesus is and the way to begin to follow him. And in following him we are told to imitate him in his obedience to God the Father, in speaking words of encouragement and peace to others, and giving something of ourselves as a way of promoting the common good of all. After Peter responds to Jesus' question by stating that he is "the Messiah, the Son of the Living God," Jesus addressed Peter as Simon, a name which means "to hear, or to listen". So it is the one who hears God's word and listens to his voice who is able to discern Jesus' true identity through the din of false and deceptive voices, and in knowing who Jesus really is, to follow his path with assurance, with peace of soul, and with hope.

# RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS

If you or someone you know have not been baptized or have not received the Sacraments of Holy Communion or Confirmation, and would like to, the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA) is meant for you. The RCIA is the process by which the Church receives new members into our Catholic community through the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Eucharist). It consists of instruction sessions and liturgical celebrations meant to inform individuals of the teachings of the Catholic faith, to help them discern whether they wish to become Catholic and to prepare them to be received into the Church at Easter. These classes are also open to adult parishioners who would like to be more informed about their faith.

We are sure many of you are already aware that the church AC is not working. Two summers ago, it also broke down and we had the compressor among other components replaced. Since the unit is almost 30 years old replacement parts are difficult to obtain, and only have a 1-year warranty. So, we are again in the same position. The cost 2 years ago was approximately \$18,000. We currently have a choice to make either to again replace the compressor (approx. \$15,000) or to get a new system all together. Granted a new system will cost around \$90,000 which is a considerable amount of money it would give us some assurances, moving forward that we would not have to address the air conditioning system for some time. To replace the existing or to get a new system all together will all take time, and so for the remainder of the summer days of heat our Sunday Masses will be in the gym.

We greatly appreciate your patience as we do our best to remedy this issue.
