We average about 442 people attending our 3 Masses each weekend.

In 2018 we had 33 Baptisms, 28 First Holy Communion, 28 Confirmed, 4 Weddings, 40 Funerals

Since it's inception Saint Joseph's Table has served 2,809 meals since its inception in February 2015 and averages 90 meals served each month.

Our Food Pantry has served 24,360 people since its inception in July 2013. We averaged 205 people served this year at each pantry.

This February will start my fifth year in Port and we have put over \$250,000 into our parish plant, this is not including the projects we have done in the cemetery. We started with the ramp, the rectory roof, the boilers in the school, the front doors, Most Sacred Heart Hall, and the front sidewalk. We could not have done this without your generosity. I'm sure you've seen our collections have been going down. If this trend continues we will not be able to maintain our parish in the way we have been called to. Also, please continue to fulfill your Renew and Rebuild pledges. Our next large project will be fixing the Good Shepherd Window and all of the other front windows on the Church.

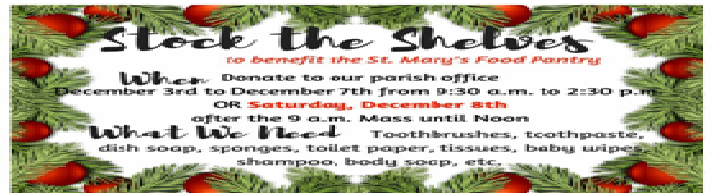
