## **S.J.B. ANNOUNCEMENTS** **December 27, 2015**

**FEAST OF THE HOLY FAMILY:** Today's feast echoes the reality of the Incarnation: by becoming flesh, Jesus became part of a particular family in Nazareth as well as the universal family of humanity. The "holy family" is not insulated from suffering and sorrow. They are a real family who knows what it means to be persecuted and driven from their homeland but who trust in God nonetheless.

Our first reading (1Sm. 1:20-28) recalls Hannah's action of presenting her child Samuel in the temple and dedicating him to the Lord – a clear foreshadowing of the presentation Joseph and Mary will make of the infant Jesus. Our second reading (1Jn. 3:1-24) insists that the love God had bestowed on us through His Son has made us His children; we are now members of God's family. Finally, our gospel (Lk. 2:41-52) recounts the pilgrimage made to Jerusalem by the Holy Family when Jesus was 12. This episode – the only gospel story about Our Lord's life from the time of His infancy to His baptism by John in the Jordan – demonstrates how Jesus' focus on His Father's will is balanced by His mother's equally intense effort to discover God's will for her family.

### **CHRISTMAS WEEK -- SAINTS' DAYS**

#### **Monday, December 28<sup>th</sup> – Holy Innocents**

Matthew's Gospel reports how King Herod, out of fear and jealousy of this newborn king, ordered the massacre of all the boys in Bethlehem and its vicinity two years old and under – (Mt. 2:16). Having been warned in a dream, Joseph took Mary and the Infant Jesus and fled to Egypt. Jesus escaped, but these innocent little ones became the victims of Herod's insane fear.

#### **Tuesday, December 29<sup>th</sup> – St. Thomas Becket, Martyr**

Born in London in 1118, Thomas became Lord Chancellor of England under King Henry II; Henry then persuaded the Pope to appoint Thomas Archbishop of Canterbury. The king hoped his friend would help him exercise control over the church, but Thomas defended the church and was murdered by agents of the king in Canterbury Cathedral in 1170.

#### **Thursday, December 31<sup>st</sup> – St. Sylvester I, Pope**

Sylvester was Pope in the early part of the 4<sup>th</sup> century – at a time when Constantine became the first Roman emperor to end the persecution of Christians. There was still a great deal of hostility and many heretical sects to be defended against. Sylvester was one of the first non-martyrs to be venerated as a saint.

#### **Friday, January 1, 2015– Feast of Mary, Mother of God**

Following the ancient tradition of celebrating the octave (eighth day) of an event, we celebrate again the mystery of Jesus' birth, but this time with our eyes on Mary. This is actually the oldest feast of Mary in our Calendar. When we celebrate her as the Mother of God we are, at the same time, celebrating the divinity of Jesus, who was truly Man and truly God. Today is the first day of the new calendar year – and it is appropriate that we begin the year by honoring Mary who was instrumental in bringing God's son into the world. Indeed, the celebration of Christ at Christmas is still very much the context of this special feast. The Preface of the Blessed Virgin Mary which is used at all Masses today speaks of the motherhood of Mary and refers to her son as the "light of the world" – a significant Christmas theme. When the Church's Council of Ephesus in 431 formally conferred the title of "Mother of God" on Mary, it was also clarifying the true nature of Jesus as truly God and truly man. In celebrating today's solemnity, we honor Mary and we acknowledge the true identity of her child.

Our first reading today (Num. 6:22-27) is an ancient Jewish blessing traced back to Moses and Aaron – a threefold divine affirmation of highest regard. In our second reading, (Gal.4:4-7) St. Paul celebrates the relationship we enjoy with God by adoption. Thanks to the incarnation of God's Son "born of a woman", we are no longer slaves – we are God's heirs and we are able to call God "Abba" –

Father! Finally in the gospel (Luke 2:16-21) the shepherds came to see the Christ Child and go away rejoicing and witnessing to others. In the center of this reading is the figure of Mary, thoughtful and prayerful. Throughout Luke's gospel Mary is a figure of hope – the one who brings about in her Son fulfillment of all the ancient prophecies, the true disciple who lives the good news that her son proclaims.

#### **Saturday, January 2<sup>nd</sup> – St. Basil and St. Gregory Nazianzen**

These two men – leaders of the so-called "Eastern" Church (an area whose center in the early church was Constantinople, instead of Rome) lived in the fourth century. They were bishops, theologians and outstanding leaders. Later they were named "doctors of the church" because of their contributions to Christology and the understanding of the Mystery of the Trinity.

**Christmas Traditions: *The Crèche***

- The most meaningful of all Christmas traditions is the nativity scene, for it brings to our mind Jesus – the center of Christmas and of our lives. Although there were representations of the Christmas crib in both the Holy Land and in Rome beginning in the fourth century, St. Francis of Assisi in the thirteenth century is usually credited with erecting the first complete manger scene. Francis saw in the Child Jesus a perfect model for us to imitate – and he wanted to make Jesus the center of Christmas celebration. So, near a church near Assisi, Francis set up the first manger with live animals and real people playing the roles of Mary, Joseph and the shepherds. The popularity of nativity scenes in churches and homes quickly spread – and reached artistic heights in the figures made by 18<sup>th</sup> century artisans in Naples, Italy.

**Holy Day Schedule:** This Friday, January 1<sup>st</sup>, the Feast of Mary, Mother of God, is a holy day of obligation. We will have one Vigil Mass on New Year’s Eve, December 31<sup>st</sup> at 5:00 p.m.; we will have one Mass on Friday, January 1<sup>st</sup> at 9:00 a.m. There will be no evening Mass at St. John’s on New Year’s Day.

**Christmas Envelopes:** For anyone who did not receive a Christmas envelope in the mail, they are available at the exits of the Church and in the sacristy. Christmas is traditionally a time for giving – because we are especially aware at this holy season of everything that God has given us through His Son. Your special sacrifice at this time of year does so much to insure that St. John’s will be able to meet the many needs of our people and continue to be such a special church in which to pray, to hear God’s word, and to receive the sacraments. God bless you for your goodness.



**New Year’s Resolution:**

One resolution we can all make is to try to participate more fully and more prayerfully in the Mass. Coming to Mass on Sunday is truly THE most important thing we do in the whole week. We should try to arrive early, spend some time in prayer before Mass then actively respond to the prayers (and in sung Mass, the hymns) of the Mass. Whenever possible there should be some time after Mass for a brief Thanksgiving. At the very least let us resolve never to arrive late for Mass or leave Mass early during 2016.

**New Year’s Day:** Following the ancient tradition of celebrating the octave (eighth day) of an event, we celebrate again the mystery of Jesus’ birth, but this time with our eyes on Mary. This is actually the oldest feast of Mary in our Calendar. When we celebrate her as the Mother of God we are, at the same time, celebrating the divinity of Jesus, who was truly Man and truly God. In recent times January 1<sup>st</sup> has been designated as a day of prayer for peace. This recommendation calls us as the New Year begins, to pray and work for peace in our homes, in our nation and in our world. This feast of Mary, Mother of God, is a holy day of obligation. We will have one Vigil Mass on New Year’s Eve, December 31<sup>st</sup> at 5:00 p.m.; we will have one Mass on Friday, January 1<sup>st</sup> at 9:00 a.m. There will be no evening Mass at St. John’s on New Year’s Day.

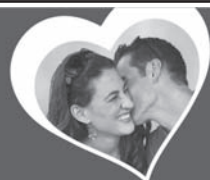
