THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER: Our songs are punctuated with Alleluias, our heads sprinkled with Easter water. Our ministers wear the white of the resurrection, while lilies and other flowers fill our sanctuaries with the beauty of spring.

How rudely, then, does today's first reading from the Acts of the Apostles (5:27-41) intrude on our season of joy! Acts, after all, is just what its title implies: a recounting of what happened in the earliest Christian communities between the death and resurrection of Jesus and the arrest of Paul some thirty years later.

These men and women are avowed followers of a convicted, executed criminal, who had aroused the animosity of prominent Jewish leaders. Why treat his followers differently? Yet, as we listen to the interrogation, we cannot help but notice that, despite accusations, imprisonments and floggings, the disciples "left the Sanhedrin full of joy." So Christian joy is something much different from transient giddy happiness; it does not free us from the cross and tomb, but allows us to look beyond them to Easter glory.

In our second reading (Rv. 5:11-14) St. John utters this same truth in his vision. Why do countless numbers praise the Lamb? Because he was slain but lives. Jesus is alive; our hope is vindicated. This is the real source of Christian consolation.

Lambs – and fish – fill the gospel (Jn. 21:1-19) too. In a slice of post resurrection life, we see the disciples back in their boats, frustrated after a fruitless night's work. Their willingness to take a "stranger's" suggestion results in tremendous success, followed by the shout of recognition, "It is the Lord!" Peter's impetuous swim and Jesus' thoughtful provision of a fire and a meal give this episode an endearing, human quality. The use of meals in post-resurrection appearances highlights the reality of the event for the disciples and the meaning of Eucharist: it is spiritual food to be shared with all who hunger.

SPECIAL SAINT'S DAY THIS WEEK – Easter Week Three

Monday, April 11th – St. Stanislaus

Born in Poland in 1030, Stanislaus studied in Paris, was ordained a priest and eventually was named Archbishop of Cracow (the very same position Pope John Paul II held before he was elected Pope). Stanislaus was devoted to the poor – and when he confronted Poland's king for his sinful behavior, he was put to death.

Wednesday, April 13th – St. Martin I

Martin was a native of Italy who was elected Pope in 649 during a time of controversy over the nature of Christ.

The heresy he opposed was known as Monothelism – but it was just another variation of the confusion many had about the human and divine natures of Christ; and the Church today benefits from those who struggled and suffered in order to preserve orthodoxy.



The Meaning of the Easter Season: The word Easter, derived from Old English, means "to shine," especially to shine like the dawn, and suggests both an action and a beginning, a new day. Thus, the Jesuit poet Gerard Manley Hopkins, speaking of Christ, uses easter as a verb in "The Wreck of the Deutschland": "Let him easter in us, be a dayspring to the dimness of us, be a crimson-cresseted east" Hopkins provides a helpful attitude or disposition for us as we enter into Easter Time, the 50 days from Easter Sunday to Pentecost Sunday. Although this liturgical time is considered one feast and is called the Great Sunday, we observe several significant moments. We begin with the robust return of the Alleluia, a song of joy and praise that Christ is risen; He has conquered death, and we delight in the full participation of those newly Baptized and Confirmed. Just as they need this liturgical time as a period of growth in their experience of the sacraments they have just received, we as a Church community need this liturgical time to deepen our understanding and participation in the Paschal Mystery.

The Sunday Liturgies can be a form of catechesis about the meaning of the Fifty Days for the entire community. The Easter symbols of the white vestments, the presence of the Paschal candle, and the use of holy water are tangible signs of Baptism and of the new life we celebrate.

The sheer scope of the liturgical time explains why we can't sustain the intense joy of Easter Sunday but, like the disciples, we too may experience doubt or fear as we realize with what we, as followers of Jesus, are charged. Fortunately, the Scripture readings during this special season guide and inspire us as we listen to accounts of Jesus' post-Resurrection appearances, his Ascension, the coming of the Holy Spirit, and the growth of the early Church.

Easter Tradition – The Easter Egg: There is an ancient legend that on the first Good Friday Simon of Cyrene was in the marketplace in Jerusalem buying food for his family. He had purchased a basket of eggs when a Roman soldier ordered him to assist a man who was carrying a cross on his way to be crucified. Simon left his basket of eggs with the grocer and went to help. When they reached Golgotha the soldier pushed Simon away, but not before Jesus thanked him and promised He would give Simon a sign that He had risen.

Simon watched from a distance as Jesus died His agonizing death and all the next day Simon was haunted by the experience. Finally two days later, Simon remembered the eggs he had bought – and he rushed back to the marketplace. The grocer handed Simon his basket – and when he looked in it he saw that each of the eggs had changed. Some were brightly colored; others had beautiful designs on them. Simon remembered the Lord's promise – and he became a believer on the first Easter Sunday.

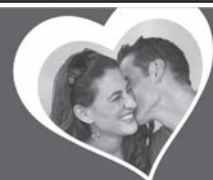
