Holy Communion for the sick and Homebound:

Before Covid-19 it was our practice here at St. John's to have Eucharistic Ministers visit the homes and bring the Eucharist to parishioners who requested it. Obviously visits to the home by nonfamily members is not possible under current conditions. Should someone wish communion at home we ask a family member to contact the rectory; Deacon Ramoni will arrange to meet that person and instruct him or her on how to bring communion to the sick or homebound individual. We will also provide a pyx (the vessel which holds the host).

S.J.B. ANNOUNCEMENTS January 24, 2021

THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: The Gospel this Sunday (Mark 1:14-20) continues the first chapter of the Gospel of Mark, emphasizing the three-fold message about vocation, ministry, and Jesus as the one who calls us, shows us what to do and encourages us on the way!

Look to the psalmody today for an uplifting message of praise (Psalm 98), promise (Psalm 25) and gladness of heart (Psalm 34). Psalm 98, "Sing a New Song," is given as the Entrance antiphon today. It is a psalm of praise for God's power. It reminds us that beauty and truth surround God and enfold us as well. The psalm that follows the First Reading pleads for the direction God provides. Psalm 34, the Communion Antiphon, bids us be glad in the Lord.

The vocation story of the Gospel of Mark is more urgent than that of the other gospel writers. To follow Jesus is a sure way to "reform your life and be served." The immediacy of the response from these fishermen is impressive. The first reading, on the other hand, about the call to repentance issued by Jonah, does not include the part about Jonah's initial reluctance to follow the call to bring that message (Jon. 3:1-5; 10).

The Opening Prayer makes it clear that it is God's work that we all must do. It is the work of God to bring the kingdom of unity and peace to all people. Direct your love that is within us, we pray. We are affirmed in the vocation to which we are called and, therefore, given the grace to act in God's loving name.

SPECIAL SAINT'S DAY THIS WEEK

Monday, January 25^h – Conversion of Paul

This feast celebrates one of the greatest conversions of all time. Saul, a fierce persecutor of the Church became – almost overnight – just as fiercely devoted to Christianity and in a matter of a few years the greatest Christian evangelist in history. Let us pray today for all those who are preparing to enter the Catholic Church.

Tuesday, January 26th – Sts. Timothy and Titus

These two men lived in the very first century of the Christian era; they were disciples and associates of St. Paul and they were appointed bishops of the Church in Ephesus and Crete. The letters written to them in the New Testament give us extraordinary witness to the life of the Church at the very beginning.

Wednesday, January 27th - St. Angela Merici

In the late 15th century, Angela founded a congregation of women (the Ursulines) dedicated to teaching children and caring for the poor – two of the tasks that have been an essential part of the Church's mission in every age.

Thursday, January 28th - St. Thomas Aquinas

Thomas was the son of noble Italian parents who intended for him to be a Benedictine monk. Thomas was attracted to the newly formed Order of Preachers (Dominicans) and eventually made his way into their ranks. A great scholar and man of prayer, Thomas preferred a humble way of life. His legacy has prevailed as one of the greatest theologians in the Church. Known as the "Angelic Doctor". Thomas is the patron of schools and colleges.

Miracle Cleaners: It's been 5 years since Julian and Diana Della Cruz took over "Miracle" Dry Cleaners on Yonkers Avenue across from our church and school. In those years they established themselves as responsible members of our community, noted for their excellent service and positive attitudes. They also moved to an apartment on Seminary Avenue, joined our parish and baptized their first child at St. John's. Julian has also been an active member of our Holy Name Society. Over a week ago their cleaning establishment was wiped out by a terrible fire. They have very little insurance and their savings was invested in their store. We will make sure all donations go directly to Julian and Diana. Please keep them in your prayers.

<u>Second Collection</u>: In order to limit the interaction between ushers and parishioners at Mass, we will <u>eliminate</u> second collections until further notice. The ushers will pass the baskets <u>only once</u> – at the usual time. If a second collection has been scheduled, we ask envelope users to place both envelopes for that Sunday in the collection basket – and we ask everyone to be as generous as their means permit.

Mass Requests for 2022: The Mass "book" for 2022 will be open for reservations as of Tuesday, February 23rd. Because of the number of Parishioners who wish to arrange Masses at St. John's, we must request that Mass reservations be made in person. On February 23rd those seeking to make Mass reservations should do so in the lower church (not the rectory) starting at 9:00 a.m. Someone will be there all morning and in the afternoon until 3:00 p.m. After February 23rd, Mass requests for 2022 should be made in the rectory, Monday-Friday from 9:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m. Our office staff is simply unable to handle requests by phone if they are to complete the regular volume of work they have. In addition, individual Mass reservations are limited to three on February 23rd so we may accommodate as many parishioners as possible. (After the initial day, more Mass reservations may be made at the rectory later in the week.) We remind everyone that there are a number of retired priests who are able to take Mass requests – even for 2021. We are happy to provide Mass cards for these Masses; however, they will not be celebrated here at St. John's. MASKS ARE REQUIRED.
