

Scripture Reflection

Jesus fasted forty days and was tempted by the devil

What lesson can we learn from Jesus' temptation in the wilderness? How can we hope to fight temptation and overcome sin in our own personal lives? When Jesus went out into the wilderness to fight temptation by the devil, he was led by the Holy Spirit. Jesus did not rely on his own human strength and will-power for overcoming temptation. He relied on the Holy Spirit to give him strength, wisdom, courage, and self-control. The Lord Jesus knows that we cannot fight temptation on our own. We need the strength and guidance of the Holy Spirit to help us. The Lord Jesus gives us his Holy Spirit to help us in our weakness and to be our guide and strength in times of testing.

The forty days of Lent is the annual retreat of the people of God in imitation of Jesus' forty days in the wilderness. We are called to journey with the Lord in a special season of prayer, fasting, almsgiving, repentance, and renewal as we prepare to celebrate the feast of Easter, the Christian Passover. The Lord gives us spiritual food and supernatural strength to seek his face and to prepare ourselves for spiritual combat and testing. We, too, must follow in the way of the cross in order to share in the victory of Christ's death and resurrection. As we begin this holy season of preparation and renewal, let's ask the Lord for a fresh outpouring of his Holy Spirit that we may grow in faith, hope, and love, and embrace his will more fully in our lives. Adult Faith Formation: Please join Sr. Catherine Gormley as she begins the next adult formation season with lively discussions of faith and scripture. Class is in the rectory after the 9:00 am Mass, Sunday, February 28, 2016. Topic: "The Community of Creation." We will look at our connection with all of God's creation. We are in communion with all of nature-- the plants, hills, rivers, animals and other humans. This forms the basis of community. Genesis and the creation story is a good place to begin and then we will look at Job 38 as God "answers" Job from the whirlwind. Psalm 104 also shows us the glory of creation and we will end our class with some excerpts from *Laudato Si*, Pope Francis's encyclical on the environment. Come and join us for discussion as well as coffee and Danish.

Confessions can be heard at any time by calling Fr. Raphael at 688-5617.

Fasting requires that only one full meal be taken per day. Two other smaller meals may be taken during the day to maintain physical strength. Fasting obliges all those who have reached the age of 18 and continues to oblige until age 59.

Abstinence prohibits individuals from eating meat on a particular day. Abstinence obliges all those who have reached the age of 14 and continues to oblige throughout their entire life. Those not specifically obliged to abstain from eating are encouraged to join in this discipline to the extent that they are able.

Reminder: Good Friday is a day of Fasting and Abstinence. All Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence.

<u>Lent</u>: The word "Lent" is an old English word which means "springtime." May this Lent really be a new springtime in the lives of each of us. Through prayer, through fasting from food accompanied by forgiving others and not bearing grudges, and through donating from our surplus to help the poor, may we like Jesus in the desert for forty days overcome temptation and thus be well prepared to celebrate Easter.

Stations of the Cross -- During Lent we strive to become closer to God through sacrifice, prayer, and alms giving. One of the opportunities for increased prayer time is praying the Stations of the Cross at 7:00 pm on Fridays during Lent.



Papal Visit to the Americas: Pope Francis will be in Mexico from February 12-17. Before landing in Mexico on the 12th, the Pontiff will stop in Havana, Cuba for an historic meeting with His Holiness Patriarch Kirill of Moscow and All Russia, the Primate of the largest Orthodox Church. While the Roman and Orthodox churches have been in dialogue over the years, there has never been an official meeting between its respective leaders. The Holy See and the Patriarchate of Moscow released a joint statement that the meeting will be a "sign of hope for all people of good will" and "they invite all Christians to pray fervently for God to bless this meeting, that it may bear fruits." The CORPORAL WORKS OF MERCY

Pope Francis has called all Catholics to focus our attention on the poor. He reminds us that the Corporal Works of Mercy provide basic building blocks - a shorthand of seven actions we are called to do:

Feed the hungry
Shelter the homeless
Bury the dead

Give drink to the thirsty Visit the sick

Clothe the naked Visit the imprisoned

These seem obvious on the surface, but as we answer the question: Who are the poor in our midst in Phoenicia/Shandaken? We may find some subtleties that we haven't considered before. When we are open to change our thinking about the poor, we may also be motivated to change our behaviors. Throughout Lent, we will try to unpack the works of mercy in the weekly bulletin, and invite you to a new understanding.
