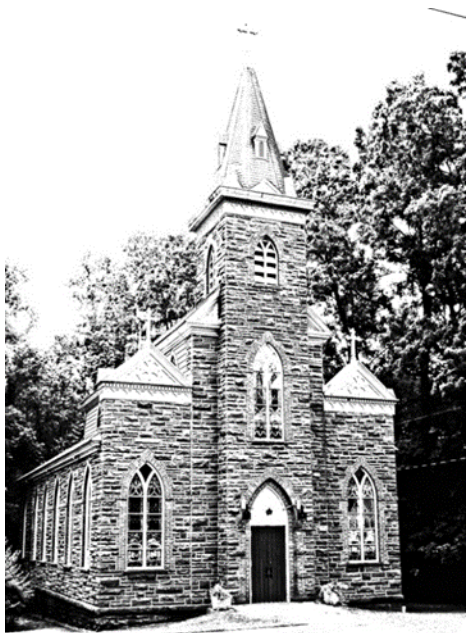

Scripture Reflection

"Not to be served but to serve"

Those who wish to serve with the Lord Jesus and to exercise authority in God's kingdom must be prepared to sacrifice - not just some of their time, money, and resources - but their whole lives and all that they possess! Jesus used stark language to explain what kind of sacrifice he had in mind. His disciples must drink his cup if they expect to reign with him in his kingdom. The cup he had in mind was a bitter one involving crucifixion. What kind of cup does the Lord have in mind for us? For many, it entails the long routine of the Christian life, with all its daily sacrifices, disappointments, set-backs, struggles, and temptations.

A disciple of Jesus must be ready to lay down his or her life - each and every day in the little and big sacrifices required - and even to the point of shedding one's blood if necessary for the sake of Christ and his Gospel. What makes such sacrifice a joy rather than a burden? It is love - the kind of "love which God has poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit which has been given to us". An early church father summed up Jesus' teaching with the expression: "to serve is to reign with Christ." We share in God's reign by laying down our lives in humble service and love for one another, just as Jesus did for our sake. First Letter to the Corinthians

Sr. Catherine's class will visit Corinth, an ancient city with incredible problems. Paul spent about 1-1/2 years in this city and now, writing from Ephesus, he expresses his concerns about this community. The Corinthians had written to Paul asking questions about their new faith and he has had reports from others that things are not going all that well there. He is upset about their quarrels and division and he counsels them about sexual morality, lawsuits, marriage and virginity, offerings to the idols and their conduct at public worship. Contained in the letter are two very poetic and beautiful images: hymn to love and the body of Christ. Come and join us! After 9:00 Mass in the Rectory Dining Room.
