Sacramental Sponsor Certificates

The following is required by Cannon Law to be a Catholic Godparent/Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. 1. Be at least 16 years of age. 2. Have completed the Sacraments of the Initiation. (Baptism, Eucharist & Confirmation) 3. Be a registered and active parishioner living a life of faith. If married, have a marriage that is canonically valid and recognized by the Catholic Church.

Parents or legal guardians are encouraged to register 2 months in advance to schedule a baptism. Parents and Guardians are required and sponsors are encouraged to attend the Baptismal Formation Session prior to the Baptism. Baptisms are celebrated on Sundays following the 12:30 Mass at 1:45 PM. Please contact Deacon Sal Vicari at ext. 218 to make arrangements.

<u>Marriages</u>

The Sacrament of Marriage requires a time of spiritual preparation. According to the Common Policy adopted by the Bishops of New Jersey, this preparation requires sessions with a priest or deacon, Focus review and attendance at a Marriage Preparation Programs such as Pre Cana. Therefore couples should make arrangements with the Church at least 1 year before the planned wedding date and finalizing any social plans. Couples must also verify freedom to marry before dates and arrangements can be made. Please contact Deacon Sal Vicari at ext. 218 to make arrangements.

Please notify the Parish Office when serious illness occurs and when the sick, aged, or incapacitated are confined to home for extended period. In an emergency call Parish office anytime.

These books prepare us spiritually for the coming of Christ through prayer and scripture in a provoking lasting way. Please take a copy for yourselves and another to share with a friend.

Reflections for Shirty Shird Sunday in Ordinary Sime



As we approach the end of the Church year, our Gospel invites us to consider Jesus' predictions and teaching about the end of the world. In the context of Mark's Gospel, Jesus' words about this are spoken to his disciples as he prepares them for

his passion and death.

Last Sunday we heard Jesus' observation about the contributions being made to the temple treasury and the example of sacrificial giving that he saw in the poor widow's offering. If we had been reading Mark's Gospel continuously, we would have heard Jesus predict the destruction of the Temple, his teaching about the costs of discipleship, and the woes that will accompany the end times. Finally, we would have heard Jesus instruct his disciples about the need for watchfulness so that they will not be caught unprepared for this final day of judgment.

In today's Gospel, Jesus continues this teaching by offering his disciples signs to look for that will indicate that the coming of the Son of Man is near. His words and images draw upon Old Testament imagery, especially images found in the Book of Daniel. Next, Jesus offers the lesson of the fig tree, a parable that teaches that if one knows how to read the signs, one can be prepared for the end times. Jesus also teaches, however, that no one knows when the end time will come, except the Father. In the verses that follow this reading in Mark's Gospel, Jesus continues to warn his disciples to be on watch for this end time.

Jesus' words are not spoken to frighten his disciples, nor should they frighten us. Rather, they are offered to prepare us for the changes we will experience during our lifetimes and at the end times. Our consolation and hope is found in the lasting nature of Jesus' words and God's neverending love for us.

This weekend we celebrate the penultimate Sunday of the Church year (it isn't often that I get to use the word "penultimate"; if you don't know what it means, I invite you to look it up). As such, I'd like to mention two changes that we will be implementing regarding our Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion (EMHCs).

The first is the local institution of a rite adopted by several parishes, the Sending of Extraordinary Ministers to the Homebound and Hospitalized. At many weekend and daily Masses, we have individuals who have stepped forward and offered to bring Jesus to those who are unable to attend Mass due to illness, age or infirmity. Taking place immediately following Communion at Mass, these persons will be called forward to be given a brief exhortation and blessing as they are excused to exercise their ministry to those unable to join us at worship due to circumstances beyond their control. This will be a marvelous opportunity for us to pray for them as well as those who reach out to them in exercising their call to serve God's people.

The second is a change to the "flow" of Communion during Mass. In my brief time here, I have been struck by the difficulties encountered while distributing the Eucharist; placing pews directly against the side walls always pose this challenge. At Visitation, this has resulted in a fair amount of "cross-traffic" in the aisles. To address this, I am hoping to increase the number of EMHCs in the center aisle, resulting in an additional EMHC for the Blessed Sacrament (the consecrated hosts) in the front section. To do this well, I am seeking additional EMHCs so that we can properly cover all stations at every weekend Mass. In other words, I am asking for your help. We gratefully welcomed some individuals as new EMHCs in our orientation seminars but we still are in need. If you have been feeling the call to participate more in the life of your parish, please consider this as an opportunity to answer that call. For those who have already responded as EMHCs, I ask to review your Mass availabilities and preferences. Some Masses have few EMHCs available while others have many more than needed. If we could re-assign – even if only occasionally – individuals generously offering such availability, we could better meet this vital need. Please contact the Rectory office is you can do so.

As we prepare to enter another year in our liturgical calendar, we will have several opportunities of change and improvement at both the parish and diocesan levels. I look forward to walking with you in this coming year of grace as we journey closer to God's Kingdom.


