Sacramental Sponsor Certificates

(Baptism, Eucharist & Confirmation) 3. Be a registered and active parishioner living a life of faith. If married, have a marriage that is canonically valid and recognized by the Catholic Church.

Marriages

The Sacrament of Marriage requires a time of spiritual preparation. According to the Common Policy adopted by the Bishops of New Jersey, this preparation requires sessions with a priest or deacon, Focus review and attendance at a Marriage Preparation Programs such as Pre Cana. Therefore couples should make arrangements with the Church at least 1 year before the planned wedding date and finalizing any social plans. Couples must also verify freedom to marry before dates and arrangements can be made. Please contact Deacon Sal Vicari at ext. 218 to make arrangements.

Please notify the Parish Office when serious illness occurs and when the sick, aged, or incapacitated are confined to home for extended period. In an emergency call Parish office anytime.

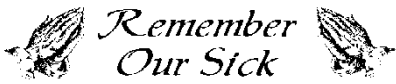

The Third Sunday in Lent

Luke tells us that some among the crowds report to Jesus a massacre of Galileans by Pilate. The intention of the crowd seems to be to ask Jesus to explain why these people suffered. It was commonplace to render people's suffering as evidence of their sinfulness. Jesus challenges this interpretation. Those who were massacred were no more or less sinful than the ones who report the situation to Jesus. Jesus replies that even a fatal accident, a natural disaster, ought not to be interpreted as punishment for sin.

Jesus' words at first appear to have a fire-and-brimstone quality. Jesus says in essence, "Repent or perish as these people did; all are sinful before God and deserving of God's punishment." The tone changes, however, in the parable that follows. The parable of the barren fig tree contrasts the patience and hopefulness of the gardener with the practicality of the property owner. When told to cut down the fig tree because it is not producing fruit, the gardener counsels patience. If properly tended, the barren fig tree may yet bear fruit.

Throughout his journey to Jerusalem, Jesus has been teaching about the Kingdom of God. In this parable, we find an image of God's patience and hopefulness as he prepares his Kingdom. God calls us to repent, and it is within his power to punish us for our failure to turn from our sinfulness. And yet God is merciful. He delays punishment and tends to us so that we may yet bear the fruit he desires from us.


This, then, is our reason for hope: Not only does God refuse to abandon us; he chooses to attend to us even when we show no evidence of his efforts. Next week's Gospel will give an even clearer picture of the kind of mercy that God shows to us.

Recently I was approached by a parishioner, visibly and understandably upset, that a friend in the hospital has not yet been visited by a priest. I apologized as I could, but I would like to bring up a very important point before a fully-avoidable tragedy does strike because, although we are given many gifts of the Holy Spirit upon ordination as priests, psychic divination is *not* included among them!

We are a diverse parish with hundreds of families. While I try to keep as current as possible with the life of our community, it's a pretty tall order for a mere human. My limitations are especially frustrating for me because as Pastor I have to switch between many hats: shopkeeper, personnel/finance manager, social director, counselor and, at times, janitor. But I remind myself that others have been given those gifts in greater quantity than I and must entrust them to fulfill those roles as well.

However, only those called by God in priestly ministry can offer the sacramental blessings of healing and forgiveness. I look upon my role as confessor and minister of Anointing to the Sick as vital and irreplaceable tasks, secondary only to the celebration of the Eucharist (for more information on the Sacrament of Anointing, please see our parish eCommunity article at <https://new.flocknote.com/note/364812>). Fr. Jim and I are also on-call for such duty – for anyone, regardless of parish affiliation – two days a week at Ocean Medical Center. As such, I do everything humanly possible – recognizing that certain exceptional situations are in God's hands, not mine – to meet the need when a sick call comes in, particularly for someone *in extremis* (at the point of death), to provide God's healing and strength. However, I do require your help to accomplish this well.

If you are aware of someone who is homebound or hospitalized and is in need of Confession or Anointing, please make us aware of it – and *don't* assume that someone else has done so. The best way is to call the parish office (732) 477-0028 and leave the name of the sick person; their address and a contact phone number so that a visit can be scheduled. If an emergency in danger of death, use option 1 and Fr. Jim or I will be paged immediately. It is generally not a good idea to tell me – or to attempt to conduct *any* kind of parish business – when I am preparing to begin or have just ended Mass: in the last few months, my memory has taken quite a beating and I will probably forget a key detail of what you tell me. A phone call or e-mail to me (pastored@visitationrccchurch.org) or a message to the office – any time of the day or night – is greatly preferred.

LENT INSTRUCTION

The days of **fast and abstinence** are **ASH WEDNESDAY AND GOOD FRIDAY**.

The other **Fridays of Lent** are **DAYS OF ABSTINENCE**.

Those between the ages of eighteen and fifty-nine are obliged to fast. By this obligation, the individual is permitted only one full meal a day.

At the age of fourteen, people are obliged to abstain. This obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk products or condiments of any kind, even though made from animal fat.

Missing abstinence on any one (1) Friday is not a serious sin. Missing abstinence most of the Fridays of Lent (or more than half of them) is a serious sin that needs to be confessed & absolved.

The obligation of receiving the Eucharist at least once a year should still be fulfilled during the period from the **First Sunday of Lent, February 14, to Trinity Sunday, May 22**. However, the Code of Canon Law does permit this precept to be fulfilled at another time during the year when there is a just cause.

PALM



With Palm Sunday just around the corner, some of you may be wondering what you should do with last year's palm once you receive this year's. There will be a basket for Palm in the narthex of the church. You may drop off your old Palm to be burned at this year's Easter Vigil.

The Diocese of Trenton is committed to the initiatives outlined in the US Bishop's Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People and to its own policies and guidelines in regard to the reporting and investigation of sexual abuse allegations involving minors. Anyone with an allegation is also encouraged to provide that information to the local enforcement authorities.

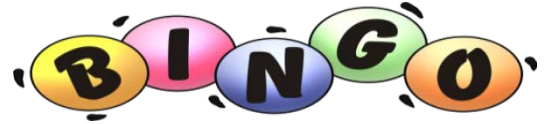

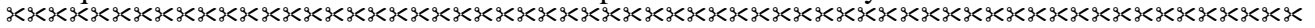
