Sacramental Sponsor Certificates

The following is required by Canon Law to be a Catholic Godparent/Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. 1. Be at least 16 years of age. 2. Have completed the Sacraments of the Initiation. (Baptism, Eucharist & Confirmation) 3. Be a registered and active parishioner living a life of faith. If married, have a marriage that is canonically valid and recognized by the Catholic Church.

Baptism

Parents or legal guardians are encouraged to register 2 months in advance to schedule a baptism. Parents and Guardians are required and sponsors are encouraged to attend the Baptismal Formation Session prior to the Baptism. Baptisms are celebrated on Sundays following the 12:30 Mass at 1:45 PM. Marriages

The Sacrament of Marriage requires a time of spiritual preparation. According to the Common Policy adopted by the Bishops of New Jersey, this preparation requires sessions with a priest or deacon, Focus review and attendance at a Marriage Preparation Programs such as Pre Cana. Therefore couples should make arrangements with the Church at least 1 year before the planned wedding date and finalizing any social plans. Couples must also verify freedom to marry before dates and arrangements can be made. Please contact Deacon Sal Vicari at ext. 218 to make arrangements.

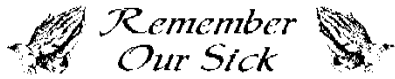

Reflections for The Tenth Sunday in Ordinary Time



The Gospel of Luke, written around A.D. 80-90, is best understood in light of the author's background. Luke was not Jewish, nor was he among the first generation of Christian disciples. He did not know or travel with Jesus. To write his Gospel, he depended on the testimony and traditions of eyewitnesses to Jesus' life and death.

Luke, as a Gentile, was intent on sharing Jesus' life story, teachings, and message of universal Salvation. In the passage before this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus cures the dying slave of a Gentile. Throughout his Gospel, Luke demonstrates that God's promises to Israel are fulfilled in Jesus and that Salvation through Jesus Christ is extended to all people.

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus and his disciples are approaching the city of Naim when they come upon a large funeral procession. The only son of a widow is being carried out. Jesus, filled with pity for the grieving mother, tells her not to weep. He then touches the coffin and tells the young man to arise. With that, the dead man gets up and starts speaking. The crowd, amazed at what they have just witnessed, praise God, saying, "A great prophet has arisen in our midst" and "God has visited his people."

This is reminiscent of what we hear in today's First Reading from 1 Kings when the prophet Elijah raised from the dead the only son of a widow. The woman's response is recognition of Elijah as a prophet, a man of God: "It is truly the word of the LORD that you speak."

For all these people, at this point in time, Jesus is a great prophet doing wonders and speaking in the name of God. Even John the Baptist sent his followers to listen to Jesus and report back to him. John's question was: "Are you the one who is to come, or should we look for another?" (Luke 7:19) The time for the full revelation of Jesus' person and his mission is yet to come.

SACRED HEART OF JESUS AND IMMACULATE HEART OF MARY

As a child my father used to take us to see his Aunts Mary & Peg, that is Aunt Mary Margaret Comerford and Aunt Margaret Mary O'Neill. It was only after their deaths that I wondered why their parents named them Mary Margaret and Margaret Mary. Could it have something to do with St. Margaret Mary Alacoque and the devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus?

June is the month dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. We just celebrated the feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus on Friday, June 3rd, and the Immaculate Heart of Mary on Saturday, June 4th. Even though St. John told us that "God is love" and St. Luke told us that a sword would pierce the heart of Mary, we don't see specific devotions to the hearts of Jesus and Mary until the second Christian millennium. Jesus appeared many times to St. Margaret Mary in the 1600s and asked her to make devotion to his Sacred Heart more popular, especially on the First Friday of the month. At Visitation we have statues representing these devotions and continue to have a holy hour on the First Friday.

Unlike many feasts, these two are not tied to particular dates but rather occur just after the feast of Corpus Christi which is after Trinity Sunday, Pentecost, and the Easter Season. Thus, we can connect these celebrations back to the Easter Triduum, the center of our liturgical year when we celebrate the institution of the Eucharist and priesthood at the Last Supper, the death of Jesus out of love for us, and his resurrection on Easter Sunday. God's love was made especially evident to us in Jesus who has also given us his mother.

It is fitting that we focus on the hearts of Jesus and Mary at this time. June is the most popular month for weddings, when a man and woman publicly exchange consent, promising to love one another until death. They desire that their love for one another would transcend ordinary loves and be imbued with the love of God. They often ask the Blessed Mother to intercede for them.

On this particular June 4th, Bishop O'Connell ordained six men to the priesthood, another commitment of love. They are being called to love us with the heart of Jesus. They ask the heart of Mary to help them be more like her Son. When we speak of the hearts of Jesus and Mary, we are really speaking about them. When we speak about the hearts of couples and priests, we are really speaking about them, about how we are all called to love like Jesus. We know we can do so by the grace of God because we see Mary doing so.

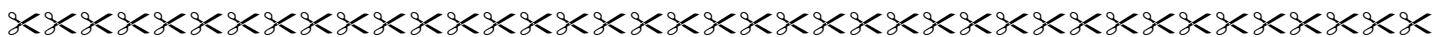

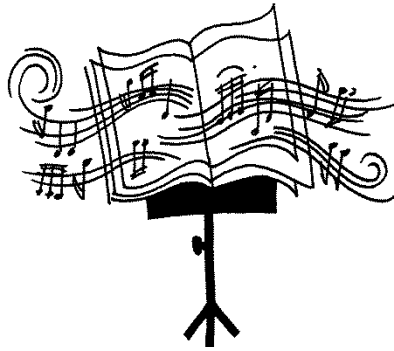

UNTIL THE FAT LADY SINGS

You know the line about opera: “It ain’t over till the fat lady sings.” The same is true about Sunday Mass. And no, the “fat lady” is not the cantor. She’s us—all of us—the church! Sated (miraculously with just a morsel and a sip), stuffed on grace, a bit tired from sincere thanksgiving and sustained praise, the assembly has to finish this liturgy before it’s over. Would the cast leave before the final curtain? The orchestra before the finale? The team before the final buzzer or last out? At Mass, we are all the cast, all the orchestra, all the team.

The end of Mass comes quickly: After the silent revery that follows communion, there is a prayer and maybe a hymn. Some announcements follow, then a blessing and dismissal, perhaps a final song. So is it really asking too much of each other to see it through to the very end? Sure, you might be blocking in someone’s car in the parking lot. But if we all stay till the end, what difference does it make? Of course the little ones are ants; we all are at this point. A few minutes more won’t hurt. (Nor will cries and squirming now.) And yes, not slipping out early means rubbing elbows with everyone, people jamming up at the doors and a procession of cars crawling out of the parking lot, but isn’t this a consequence of the communion that we just shared? Isn’t this how we know that we are becoming what we have shared: the body of Christ, risen from the dead, going out into the world to give to others what has been given to us?

It’s a simple act of kindness—finishing the liturgy before leaving. And if we slow down just enough to finish our liturgy, maybe we’ll slowly learn to finish well other things in life, too. And when we learn to relish and not rush the end of things—the last minutes of a movie, the final words of a conversation, the last hand of cards and the final set of pins to knock down—what we are truly learning is to relish and not rush the end of our days—a final act of gratitude that gives God praise.

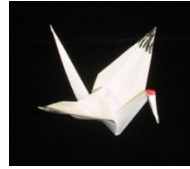
