Sacramental Sponsor Certificates

The following is required by Canon Law to be a Catholic Godparent/Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. 1. Be at least 16 years of age. 2. Have completed the Sacraments of the Initiation. (Baptism, Eucharist & Confirmation) 3. Be a registered and active parishioner living a life of faith. If married, have a marriage that is canonically valid and recognized by the Catholic Church.

Baptism

Parents or legal guardians are encouraged to register 2 months in advance to schedule a baptism. Parents and Guardians are required and sponsors are encouraged to attend the Baptismal Formation Session prior to the Baptism. Baptisms are celebrated on Sundays following the 12:30 Mass at 1:45 PM. Marriages

The Sacrament of Marriage requires a time of spiritual preparation. According to the Common Policy adopted by the Bishops of New Jersey, this preparation requires sessions with a priest or deacon, Focus review, and attendance at a Marriage Preparation Programs such as Pre Cana. Therefore couples should make arrangements with the Church at least 1 year before the planned wedding date and finalizing any social plans. Couples must also verify freedom to marry before dates and arrangements can be made. Please contact Deacon Sal Vicari at ext. 218 to make arrangements.

Anointing of the Sick

Please notify the Parish Office when serious illness occurs and when the sick, aged, or incapacitated are confined to home for an extended period. In an emergency call the Parish office anytime.

THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER



Reflections for

The Third Sunday of Easter

As in last week's Gospel, today's Gospel shows us how the first community of disciples came to believe that Jesus had risen from the dead. In these stories we gain insight into how the community of the Church came to be formed.

When we read today's Gospel, we may be surprised to learn that these friends of Jesus could walk and converse with him at some length yet not recognize him. Again we discover that the risen Jesus is not always easily recognized. Cleopas and the other disciple walk with a person whom they believe to be a stranger; only later do they discover that the stranger is Jesus. We can imagine the feelings of the two disciples in today's reading. They are leaving their community in Jerusalem. Their friend Jesus has been crucified. Their hope is gone. They are trying to make sense of what has occurred, so that they can put the experience behind them.

Jesus himself approaches the two men, but they take him for a stranger. Jesus asks them what they are discussing. He invites them to share their experience and interpretation of the events surrounding his crucifixion and death. When the two disciples have done so, Jesus offers his own interpretation of his crucifixion and resurrection, citing Jewish Scripture. In that encounter we find the model for our Liturgy of the Word—what we do each time we gather as a community for the Eucharist. We reflect upon our life experiences and interpret them in light of Scripture. We gather together to break open the Word of God.

In the next part of the story, we find a model for our Liturgy of the Eucharist. The disciples invite the stranger (Jesus) to stay with them. During the meal in which they share in the breaking of the bread, the disciples' eyes are opened; they recognize the stranger as Jesus. In the Eucharist too we share in the breaking of the bread and discover Jesus in our midst. Just as the disciples returned to Jerusalem to recount their experience to the other disciples, we too are sent from our Eucharistic gathering. Our experience of Jesus in the Eucharist compels us to share the story with others. *Loyola Press*

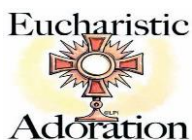

APRIL 30, 2017



This weekend, and extending over the next few weekends, our Religious Education classes will begin receiving First Eucharist at Sunday Masses. I think that this is a wonderful opportunity to review our own appreciation of this marvelous gift, whether we've started receiving it ourselves recently or it has been many years since our own First Communion. In particular, I'd like to review the reception of Communion in the hand.

Approved as an option for the United States by the Vatican in 1977, this practice is a return to a custom from the earliest days of the Church. Although the universally-accepted custom of Communion on the tongue is still quite proper, many feel that receiving the Body of Christ in the hand allows a more personal relationship with the risen Jesus through the sacrament. However, careful examination is required due to the possibility of abuse – either unintended or otherwise – to the Blessed Sacrament when receiving in this way (and sadly in my years of distributing Communion, first as an Extraordinary Minister and later as a priest, I've seen far too many instances of irreverent reception.)

When receiving Communion in the hand, make a sign of respect (a simple bow of the head is fine) and approach the minister with one opened hand placed above the other: in this way, as St. Augustine once said, we "make our hands like a worthy throne for the Eucharist." After the minister says "The Body of Christ" and you respond (the formula explicitly states to say "Amen," not "Thank you" or "I believe"), and the Blessed Sacrament is placed in your hand – which hand it is will depend on whether you are right- or left-handed – step to one side and with your other hand immediately and reverently consume the Body of Christ. Then return to your seat and offer a brief, silent thanksgiving. If we give a moment's thought of whom we are receiving in the sacrament, we cannot help but to seek to do so in the best and most respectful way possible, both for ourselves and as a positive example to those receiving Jesus for the very first time.

I ask you to pray for our First Communicants and their families: that all of us, on our journey to the heavenly Kingdom – strengthened through the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus received in the Eucharist – will courageously and joyfully witness that mystery of salvation to all we meet.
