Stations of the Cross

1. Jesus is condemned to death
2. Jesus accepts the cross
3. Jesus falls the 1st time
4. Jesus meets his mother
5. Simon helps Jesus carry the cross
6. Veronica wipes the face of Jesus
7. Jesus falls the 2nd time
8. Jesus meets the women of Jerusalem
9. Jesus falls the 3rd time
10. Jesus is stripped of his garments
11. Jesus is nailed to the cross
12. Jesus dies on the cross
13. Jesus is taken down from the cross
14. Jesus is buried in the tomb
15. Jesus is risen

Before Communion:

Lord Jesus Christ, I firmly believe that you are present in this Blessed Sacrament as true God and true Man, with you Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity. My Redeemer and my Judge, I adore your Divine Majesty together with the angels and saints. I believe, O Lord; increase my faith.

After Communion:

Jesus, I firmly believe that you are present within me as God and Man, to enrich my soul with graces and to fill my heart with the happiness of the blessed. I believe that you are the Christ, the Son of the Living God!

Absolution- Prayer that the priest says to show that God has forgiven a person's sins in the sacrament of Reconciliation

Confession- Telling your sins to the priest; confession is part of the Sacrament of Reconciliation

Contrition- Sorrow for sins

Gloria- "Glory to God in the highest, and peace to his people on earth. Lord God, heavenly King, almighty God and Father, we worship you, we give you thanks, we praise you for your glory. Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father, Lord God, Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world: have mercy on us; you are seated at the right hand of the father, receive our prayer. For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the father. Amen."

Minister- One who shares in the priesthood of Jesus through holy orders as a deacon, priest or bishop or as a specially commissioned minister at the service of the community.

Ordination- The rite by which a Bishop shares the servant ministry with priests and deacons.

Original Sin- The first sin of humankind. All of us suffer from the effects of this sin. Jesus lived and died to free us from Original Sin.

Paschal Mystery- The death and resurrection of Jesus. A mystery of our faith.

Sacrament- A celebration of God's love through which Jesus becomes present to us by the power of the Holy Spirit and we receive grace.

Anointing of the Sick- Sacrament of healing that brings Jesus' comfort to people who are very ill, old, or near death. Using holy oil, a priest anoints the forehead and hands of the sick.

Confirmation- Sacrament of initiation that makes us stronger in our faith and completes our baptism.

Holy Orders- Sacrament at the service of communion that celebrates special service in the Church as a bishop, priest, or deacon.

Matrimony- Sacrament at the service of communion between a man and a woman that celebrates their covenant to love and serve each other forever as husband and wife.

Sign- Something we can see, hear, taste or touch that stands for something.

Transubstantiation- When the bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus, done usually during the Liturgy of the Eucharist

Vocation- A call from God to serve others in a particular way; Marriage, Religious Life, single person.

Sanctus

"Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest."

Sign of the Cross: review

Our Father:

Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Amen.

Hail Mary:

Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with you. Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, mother of God, pray for us sinners, now, and at the hour of our death. Amen.

Doxology: Glory

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be forever. Amen.

Apostles' Creed:

I believe in God, the Father Almighty, creator of heaven and earth. I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit, and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.

Act of Contrition:
