Reading assignments in Exodus:

19: 1-11, 16-20

20: 1-24 Your homework was to write the 10 Commandments as positive statements. Instead of “You shall not...” write “I will . . .” for example: “I will keep the Lord first in my life above anyone or anything else.”

God calls Moses up Mount Sinai to gift His people with the Ten Commandments which He eventually writes in stone—they are permanent forever. God renews the Father/son relationship and the Commandments are the “Family Rules”. The first three are about relationship to the Father. The rest are about behavior toward brothers and sisters in our human family (our own as well as those in the world family.)

Look at the Headings in Ex 21-23. This covers additional rules derived from the Commandments to govern their life as a nation, with a government and civil laws.

Read LIVE IT on pgs. 136, 137, and 139.

Ex 24: 3- 8 Moses reads the Commandments and the people respond: \_\_\_\_\_

Then Moses built an a\_\_\_\_\_ for sacrifice and sprinkles the “b\_\_\_\_\_ of the C\_\_\_\_\_ which the Lord made with y\_\_\_\_\_” on the a\_\_\_\_\_ as well as on the p\_\_\_\_\_.

This signified they were sharing blood like family. The killing of an animal teaches that s\_\_\_\_\_ (turning away from God and the Covenant) leads to d\_\_\_\_\_ like it did for Adam and Eve, and the neighbors of Noah.
