Dear Parishioners.

if We look forward to the arrival of our newly ordained priest, Father Matthew Reiman, in just a couple of weeks. I cannot think of a better way for Father Matthew to begin his priesthood than by getting to know and serve all of you. We truly have a beautiful parish.

Today is the beautiful Feast of Corpus Christi, the Most Holy Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ. It is a day for special Eucharistic celebration and devotion, like our Eucharistic Procession after the 9:30am Mass, as we walk throughout our neighborhood with the Blessed Sacrament in the Monstrance, celebrating the Church's greatest treasure, the Real Presence of our Lord Jesus in the Eucharist, and giving witness to this marvelous belief of ours. As the Catechism of the Catholic Church puts it: "The Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life...For in the Blessed Eucharist is contained the whole spiritual good of the Church, namely Christ Himself."

Every day at every Mass the Sacrifice of Jesus on the Cross in made present for us to enter into, as bread and wine are changed into the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of the Risen Christ. Our Lord Jesus becomes really, truly and substantially present under the appearances of bread and wine. As a kid preparing for First Communion I was taught to say "My Lord and My God," when looking upon the Sacred Host and the Chalice containing the Precious Blood of Jesus as the priest raises them up at the Consecration. I still say those words at the Consecration every time I offer Mass, and I can honestly say that I get the same lump in my throat as I did on the day I offered Mass for the very first time sixteen years ago. How beautifully and powerfully we express our belief in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist and draw others to this mystery by the reverence we show toward the Most Blessed Sacrament - in our fidelity to Sunday Mass; in the way we genuflect before the Tabernacle; in the way we bow with reverence as we approach to receive Holy Communion; in the way we take time to pray and give thanks as we savor the Real Presence of our Lord Jesus in our bodies and souls after receiving Him in Holy Communion. These kinds of outward gestures of reverence speak volumes about the faith we hold deep in our hearts.

Cardinal Basil Hume, former Archbishop of Westminster, wrote just before he died: "The greatest need in the Church today is the rediscovery of the power and mystery of the Eucharist - devotion to the Real Presence of Christ in this Most Blessed Sacrament. Outside the Mass that presence continues and is celebrated through Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. That devotion was weakened in the years that followed the Second Vatican Council, but we need to rediscover it." As Pope St. Pius X put it put so beautifully: "Remember, there is no way to be closer to Jesus on this side of Heaven than by worthily receiving Him in Holy Communion."

May this beautiful Feast of Corpus Christi re-kindle our faith and our devotion, and lead us to give thanks and praise to Almighty God for giving us so precious a gift, so great a Sacrament of His Love which we have available to us right here in our own beautiful Church every day. May God bless us all.



Dear friends in the Lord:

I write on a matter of critical urgency, asking your help.

The matter is the *Education Tax Credit* – a proposal that would encourage individuals and businesses to donate more money to scholarship funds for children who choose to attend Catholic and other private schools. The tax credit also would encourage donations to public schools and nonprofits to increase funding for after-school, music, arts, sports, and classroom projects, a win-win for all children.

The Education Tax Credit is included in a broader Parental Choice in Education Agenda being pushed by Governor Andrew Cuomo and supported by the State Senate. This package of bills also would provide a \$500 tuition tax credit for low-income families.

Assembly Speaker Carl Heastie and other courageous Democrats support this measure, but, unfortunately, many members of the Assembly Majority are blocking this critical assistance for our families.

If the Assembly Democrats drop their opposition, the *Education Tax Credit* will become law. That means millions of dollars in scholarships to help needy children attend Catholic and other private schools. It means fewer Catholic school closures and more jobs for teachers.

For public schools it translates to millions of dollars for art, music, libraries and sports, as well as support for teachers.

This is where I am asking for your help!

The only way the Assembly Democrats are going to agree to these important measures is if they hear from enough families around the state, more than they do from the powerful Government School monopoly Teachers' Union.
