Update from Deacon Bob

To My Brothers and Sisters of St. Peter's

Allow me to begin by thanking you for your prayers, your kind expressions of concern and your cards. They are greatly appreciated and much needed.

It's hard to believe that it's been almost a year since I last celebrated mass with you. It's been a long road since then for Cathy and me, not knowing where the Lord was going to lead us but trusting that in His divine wisdom we would be led to the place we were called to be. That by the way is in the Mandarin section of Jacksonville Florida. In September we moved into a small house

with a nice fenced in backyard for Luke our Golden Retriever.

I have been granted faculties in the Diocese of St. Augustine which allows me to function as a deacon doing all the things I did at St. Peter's. I've been assigned (temporally) to a large parish in the area but will be reassigned in January to another parish which is when reassignments are to take place. In the Diocese of St. Augustine deacons as well as priests are reassigned after a certain period of time. The clergy and the parishioners have been very welcoming but it's not the same as St. Peter's.

I have been having a problem with my left knee for some time, which requires a total knee replacement. While being cleared for surgery, it was discovered that I had a blood clot in my heart in addition to another heart condition. The clot has been taken care of but the 2 procedures to correct the heart condition have proven to be ineffective. On November 20th, I am scheduled to be admitted to St. Vincent's hospital for a different procedure. Hopefully, this procedure will be successful and I should be home in a day or two.

Let me close by again thanking you for all your prayers and well wishes. Please know that you are in our prayers daily. We are settling in to our new house and our new parish but St. Peter's will always be home to us.
