Please note the procedures below that we need to follow for now

If you have a cough or fever please do not attend mass.

No sign of peace.

Wear your mask on the way to receive, remove it before receiving and return it immediately after receiving.

No cup will be offered.

Receive by hand - out stretched.

Please return to your vehicle immediately after mass - do not gather outside.

Please remember that for now there is no requirement for you to come back to Mass.. Those who are at a greater risk of COVID-19 (those older than 65 or who have underlying health conditions) are cautioned not to come to church for Mass. They may join us only when they feel safe and comfortable to do so.
